Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. today from the Clough-Barrick chapel for George A. Thomason, prominent in Salem business circles for almost 40 years who died Tuesday at his home, 1020 N. Cottage st., after a week's illness. The Rev. Dudley Strain is to officiate and interment will be in Belcrest Memorial park.

Born Sept. 12, 1873, in Warsaw, Benton, county, Mo., Thomason with his family came to Salem in 1909 from Coos Bay. Here he operated a meat market, first on Ferry street, later moving into the 100 block of South Commercial and later to the 100 block of North Liberty street.

"The People's Market, on the site of the present Montgomery Ward store, he sold in 1918 to Curtis Cross, and Thomason entered the real estate business in which he engaged the remainder of his life. He was associated with Rostein and Adolph at the time of his death. Greatly interested in agriculture and in its future here, he farmed as a sideline during most of his residence in Salem. He was long a member of the Salem Elks lodge.
