Grain Market Suffers Decline

CHICAGO, Oct. 16 (AP)—Weakness in cash markets undermined trading in grain futures today and deliveries, with the exception of January corn, moved into lower territory. A break in cotton at New York also had a disturbing influence on grain dealings.

Cash corn was sharply lower for the second consecutive day, dropping 5 to 15 cents a bushel on various grades. Oats eased 1 to 2 cents a bushel despite shipping sales to exporters totaling 400,000 bushels. Cash wheat was firm.

Final prices on bread cereal futures were 1 1/2-2 1/2¢ lower, January \$2.06 1/4; corn was unchanged to 1 1/2¢ lower, January \$1.39 1/4-1/4, and oats were down a cent to 1 3/4, November 84 1/2-1/4.

Some of the selling in wheat was believed to represent hedging. Dispatches from Washington said that flour was an item which probably would be decontrolled shortly in the general speed-up of removing ceilings.

The Northwestern Miller, a trade publication, said unfavorable flour ceilings were preventing mills from accepting a liberal volume of inquiries from the bakery trade. Family flour sales still are possible, the publication added.

The Canadian wheat board advanced the export tax on oats a cent a bushel to 43 cents, effective tomorrow.

Late Selling Drops Stocks

NEW YORK, Oct. 16 (AP)—Last minute selling greased the way for a declining stock market today. Final prices were down fractions to around 3 points and more although a number of stocks retained all or part of early gains. Profit cashing sales on the heels of Tuesday's sweeping advances kept shares under pressure.

Brokers said many customers also held the theory that the advance which followed the president's decontrol order was merely an interruption to a basically lower trend.

Transfers totaled 1,650,000 shares against 2,360,000 Tuesday.
