Rep. Norblad Defends Vote Against OPA

Prices would be relatively stabilized by now, in the opinion of Rep. Walter Norblad, had the federal price control program not been extended last summer. The congressman in his appearance before Salem Lions club at Hotel Marion yesterday noon, defended his vote against OPA extension in the last session of congress.

Norblad asserted that the best hope for reduction in the national debt lies in the extensive government reorganization plan drafted by the last congress. Under this plan, he explained, the ways and means and the appropriation committees of both senate and house would be required to meet jointly within the opening 30 days of a congressional session to adopt a balanced budget program, whereas the present system does not call for such coordination.

Grain Futures Take Plunge

CHICAGO, Oct. 17.—(AP)—All grain futures plunged in late trading on the board of trade today, wheat falling the 5 cent limit permitted in a single session. Corn and oats also were off 5 cents at times in heavy trading.

Weak at start, grains started to move down rapidly toward the close. Wheat was sold on fears that ceilings would not be removed from flour. Corn and oats tumbled as a result of sharply lower prices in hogs.

All wheat futures closed 5 cents lower, January \$2.01 1/4, corn was off 3 1/2-3 3/4, January \$1.35 1/4-1.36, and oats were down 3 1/4-4 1/2, November 79 1/4-80 1/4.

A model floating drydock and 30-foot-long model of the small-size "Jeep" aircraft carriers, several of which were built in Portland, will be in Salem Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, October 21-22-23, P. A. Raney, CGM, USN, of the local naval recruiting office said last night.
