### Nations Seek Modified Veto

NEW YORK, Oct. 25—(AP)—The United States assembly wound up its first week of debate today with the explosive issue of the veto still the number one question and with increasing signs that pressure might force a sharp definition of the uses of the voting power.

It was apparent after addresses by the first 13 nations and several tense committee sessions that there was little possibility at this time for a charter revision to eliminate the veto. Rather the drive aimed at forcing Russia, which has used the veto nine times in the security council, to agree to some modifications on its use.

### Chiropractor Held In Woman's Death

PORTLAND, Oct. 26—(AP)—Dr. Fred Jeannot, 50, Portland chiropractor, was arrested today on a charge of manslaughter which the district attorney said was based on the death of a Salem woman after an abortion.

Jeannot, indicted secretly by the county grand jury yesterday, was released on \$5,000 bail. District Attorney John B. McCourt said a 22-year-old Salem woman, married and with two children, died of peritonitis in Salem January 13 after an abortion performed here Jan. 5 by Dr. Jeannot.

### Hatfield Given 6-year-Term

Kenneth Hatfield, who pleaded guilty to charges of larceny and receiving, possessing and concealing stolen property, was yesterday sentenced to a total of six years in the state prison by Circuit Judge E. M. Page.

On Friday Hatfield entered a plea of guilty to the larceny charge which involved the theft and stripping of an auto, and on Saturday pleaded guilty to the theft of tools and equipment belonging to R. E. Shattuck. He was sentenced to four years on the larceny charge and two years on the stolen property charge. The sentences to run consecutively.

### British Troops Moved To India Riot Area

CALCUTTA, Oct. 26—(AP)—Additional British troops were moved into the Calcutta area tonight and others were placed on the alert as continued rioting in the city between Hindus and Moslems brought death to at least 26 persons and injuries to at least 50.

A Bengal government press note said that police had opened fire on at least six occasions today.
