

King George Opens Parliament; Churchill Favors Conscription

LONDON, Nov. 12.—(AP)—Winston Churchill renewed tonight his assertion that a vast Russian army was being maintained on a virtual war footing in Europe and promised an opening session of parliament that his opposition party would support the labor government's revolutionary proposal to continue compulsory military training in peacetime.

Churchill spoke in the house of commons in reply to a laborite motion for the acceptance of King George VI's opening speech from the throne.

The king, sitting on a golden throne in the heavily guarded house of lords, earlier had outlined the labor government's socialistic legislative program, including not only the plans for continuing conscription but also for nationalizing additional industries.

Self-Government Stressed
In his 13-minute address delivered in a setting of medieval splendor, the king said plans were underway to bring self-government to the peoples of his empire.

Soldiers with fixed bayonets guarded the building while the king spoke. As a result of the violence, attributed to Jewish underground organizations, 5,000 policemen and detectives also stood by.

Replying to the laborite motion for acceptance of the king's speech, Churchill said the government's decision to continue conscription "is one they would certainly not have reached without good and grave reasons."

Asks Support of Draft
"It will be the duty of the opposition to support the government, not only in the house of commons, but out of doors," Churchill added.

Ninety Die in Peru Quakes

LIMA, Peru, Nov. 12.—(AP)—More than 90 persons perished in a series of severe earthquakes which destroyed towns, wrecked roads and damped up rivers last Sunday in the interior of Peru. Continued earth tremblings were reported.

Communications with many communities were cut off because of toppled telegraph poles, and it was feared that the known death toll would mount much higher when complete reports are received.

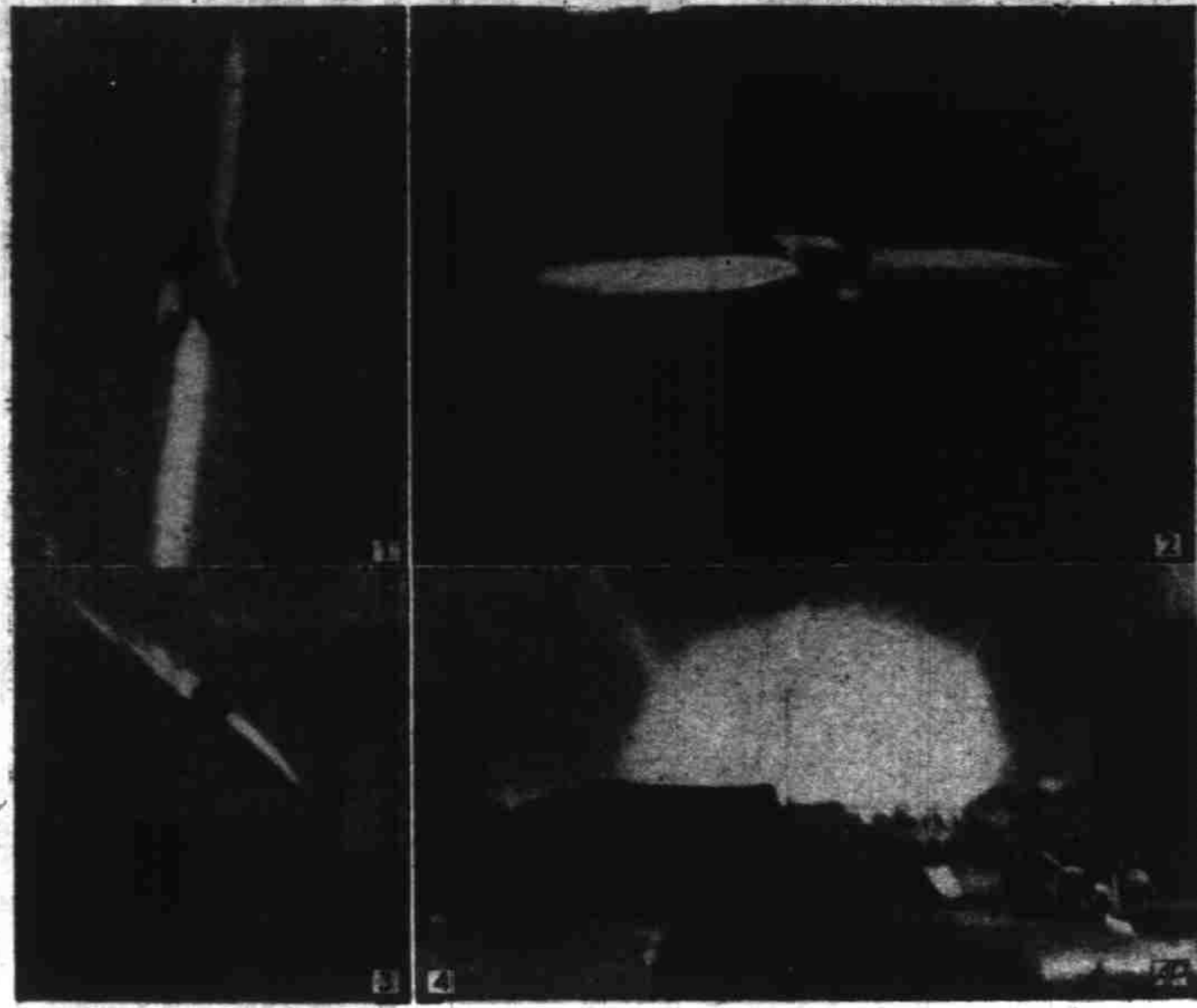

Truman Favors World Criminal Law Code Plan

WASHINGTON, Nov. 12.—(AP)—President Truman approved tonight a recommendation by former Attorney General Francis Biddle for establishment by the United Nations of a code of international criminal law.

Biddle suggested such a course in a report winding up his work as United States member of the international military tribunal which conducted the Nuremberg trials.

He submitted his resignation, which the president immediately accepted, writing him, "The setting up of such a code as that which you recommend is indeed an enormous undertaking." Mr. Truman wrote Biddle, "but it deserves to be studied and weighed by the best legal minds the world over. It is a fitting task to be undertaken by the governments of the United Nations."

Steel Span May Bridge Counties

The wooden span of the Stayton intercounty bridge may be replaced by a steel span this summer if plans as announced by the Marion county court Tuesday are executed.

The court directed that a steel bridge which formerly crossed the Burnt river in Baker county but is now dismantled, be inspected by County Engineer Hedda Swart to determine whether or not it can be used for the Stayton intercounty span. Although dimensions differ from the steel and the wooden span it is thought that with a few alterations it can be used. The steel bridge is 90 feet long and 20 feet wide, while the present wooden span is 80 feet long and 16 feet wide.

Navy Plans To Streamline Fleet Structure

WASHINGTON, Nov. 12.—(AP)—The navy is going to streamline its fleet structure, setting up task organizations in both the Atlantic and Pacific capable of dealing with what the navy calls any "fast moving situation."

Details of the reorganization, effective January 1, were announced today.

In addition to consolidating the various operating organizations the navy will establish two "task fleets," the size of which will be variable according to the jobs at hand. Their chiefs will be responsible to the commanders in chief of the Atlantic and Pacific fleets. The Pacific task fleet will be commanded by Vice Adm. E. Montgomery, the Atlantic task fleet by Vice Adm. W. H. P. Blandy.

Two flag commands—the Third fleet headed by Vice Adm. Howard F. Kingman and the Fourth fleet by Vice Adm. Daniel E. Barbey—will be abolished. Adm. John H. Towers will continue as commander in chief of the Pacific fleet and Adm. Marc Mitscher as commander in chief of the Atlantic, their commands broadened to include other organizations for purposes of administration.

Mine Owners Asked to Meet

CPA May Cut Regulations

WASHINGTON, Nov. 12.—(AP)—Small added new momentum to the sweeping decontrol drive today, forecasting elimination of some industrial controls and sharp revision of others by the first of the next week at the latest.

Although he declined to relate in detail what controls are tagged for the junk heap, Small told a news conference that "less than 30" of the remaining 45 CPA regulations "will remain."

Cardinal Dies, Sixth in Year

ROME, Nov. 12.—(AP)—Camillo Cardinal Caccia Dominioni, ranking cardinal in the order of precedence, died tonight. He was 69.

His death, the sixth in the College of Cardinals in the last year, reduced the number of princes of the Roman Catholic church to 64.

Cardinal Caccia Dominioni suffered two heart attacks last week at his residence in the palace of the holy office and a special papal benediction went to him as death approached.

A native of Milan, Cardinal Caccia Dominioni was ordained Sept. 23, 1899, and was raised to the purple by Pope Pius XI on Dec. 16, 1935.

Timber Sale off Due to Decontrol

Because OPA price controls on lumber were removed the sale of timber on O & C lands scheduled for today has been cancelled, according to A. P. Collins, district forester.

Large blocks of timber were being offered, and the chief at the O & C administration feared the sudden change in conditions might put the early bidders at a competitive disadvantage so he called off the sale. The timber will probably be offered in a December sale.

Attempts to Be Made to Identify Body

Attempts to identify the body of an elderly man found in an abandoned shack on the farm of Mrs. Missouri Loveall, Aurora will continue today when Jack Hayes, Dallas, will view the body at the Clough-Barrick funeral home.

Hayes, whose mother's name was on one of the cards found in the dead man's pocket, stated to state police that he had been in a hospital with another patient by the name of Floyd Laverne Waterman, the same as the name on a draft registration card in the dead man's wallet. The body is so badly decomposed that identification may be impossible except possibly through fingerprints, authorities indicated.

The man, tentatively identified as Waterman, apparently had been living in the shack for some time without the knowledge of Mrs. Loveall. Deputy sheriffs Henderson and Ervin were called September 8 to Aurora to investigate reports of an ill man living in the shack. A thorough search at that time however, disclosed no person in or near the building. Waterman was found Monday by L. W. Owen, grandson of Mrs. Loveall, as he searched the shack for material with which to repair his car. The body was lying in bed with a leather belt around the neck.
