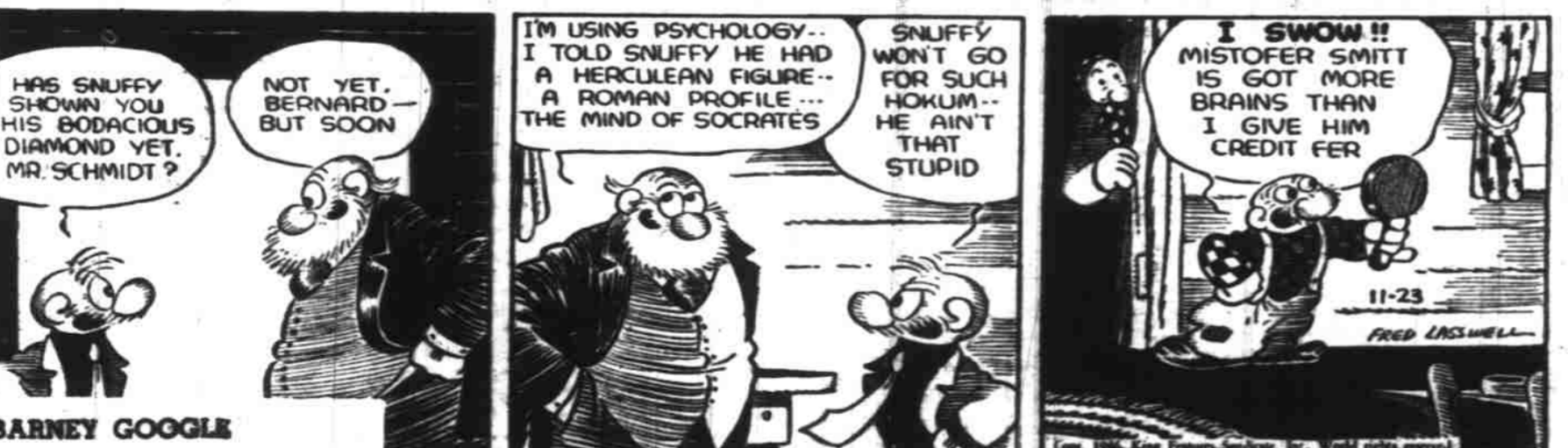

Wheat Contract Record Set
CHICAGO, Nov. 22—(P)—A top of \$2.18 a bushel was established by the January wheat contract on the Chicago Board of Trade today, making the third consecutive session on which wheat has advanced to a new 26-year high. Late selling forced the closing price down to \$2.16.

Dealers said a shortage of railroad box cars, which was making it difficult for mills to obtain grain, and heavy domestic and foreign demand for flour were responsible for the price uptick. Flour prices had advanced over the past few days, brokers said. Wheat closed 1/4 lower to 2 cents higher than yesterday, corn was 1/4 to 1 1/2 cents higher and oats 1/2 to 2 cents higher.

Rails, Industry Stage Revival
NEW YORK, Nov. 22—(P)—Selected rails and industrial negotiators met today to discuss a modest comeback in today's stock market although many leaders continued to stumble over pessimism emanating from the national coal walkout and the overall average showed its seventh successive decline for the first time in three years.

Late short covering and bidding was said to have been based on the thought that the list was over-sold and in shape for a substantial rally should a break come in the fuel impasse.

Buying in the final hour steadied trends with a number of pivots adding fractions to 2 points. Transfers of 1,200,000 shares compared with 1,300,000 Thursday.
