### Germans in U.S. Zones to Vote On Government

FRANKFURT, Germany, Nov. 30—(AP)—Nearly 7,000,000 German voters in Bavaria and Greater Hesse ballot tomorrow on new democratic constitutions and elect legislatures, and in Greater Hesse they will decide whether to follow the leftward trend in Europe and adopt socialist control of basic industries.

The third state of the American-occupied zone, Wurttemberg-Baden approved its new constitution and elected its first parliament in 13 years in elections last Sunday.

**Vote on Socialization**

In Greater Hesse, biggest industrial state of the U. S. zone, the voters will be asked not only to approve a one-house chamber but to vote on a constitutional article that calls for:

1. The socialization of mines (coal, potash, ores, etc.), iron and steel plants, power industries and the railroads, and;
2. State supervision of the largest bank and insurance companies.

The vote on socialism will be restricted to Greater Hesse. Bavaria's proposed constitution—like that of Wurttemberg-Baden—leaves the door open for socialism, but the issue will not be fought out at the polls in that strongly conservative rural area.

**Approval Predicted**

American military government observers predicted that socialism would be approved by the approximately 2,370,000 eligible voters of Greater Hesse, but it probably would be a stiff fight for the social democratic party, sponsors of the plan and dominant party in the state.

If the voters approve the constitution and also the socialization plan, the program will go into effect immediately after the first meeting of the state legislature.

### Pasteurizer Operators To Take Course, Exam

Pasteurizer operators of Marion county will attend a series of short courses and examinations in Portland December 10 through 13, the state agricultural department announced Saturday.

Operators in Washington, Clackamas, Clatsop, Columbia and Yamhill counties will also attend the second session with Marion county men. Portland operators will attend from December 2 through 5.

### Snell Majority 131,207 Votes, Canvass Notes

The official majority by which Gov. Earl Snell was re-elected over his democratic opponent, Carl C. Donough, was 131,207 votes, the secretary of state's canvass of election results shows. Snell received 237,681 votes and Donough 106,474.

Also shown in the official canvass are the following voting totals for other state and district offices and for the various state measures appearing on the November 5 ballot:

Secretary of state — Robert S. Farrell, republican incumbent, 348,359; David C. Epps, democrat, 88,672. Majority for Farrell 159,678. Farrell received the largest number of votes for any contested state or district office.

Labor commissioner — W. E. Kimsey, republican incumbent, 193,728; Ralph Peoples, democrat, 122,251. Majority for Kimsey, 71,477.

Representative in congress, 1st district — Walter Norblad, republican incumbent, 67,333; Lyman Hill, democrat, 28,778. Majority for Norblad 41,257.

Representative in congress, 2nd district — Lowell Stockman, republican incumbent, 32,341; Lamar Townsend, democrat, 15,744. Majority for Stockman 16,597.

Representative in congress, 3rd district — Homer D. Angell, republican incumbent, 74,061; Lew Wallace, democrat, 36,525. Majority for Angell 17,936.

Representative in congress, 4th district — Harris Ellsworth, republican incumbent, 42,868; Louis A. Wood, democrat, 19,118. Majority for Ellsworth 23,750.

Proposed amendment providing for succession to governor, for 221,574; against 70,322. Majority for 151,252.

Authorizing construction of state armories, for 73,663; against 219,006. Majority against 145,343.

Establishing rural school districts and school boards, for 155,735; against 134,673. Majority for 21,072.

Authorizing Chinese to hold real estate and mining claims, for 161,963; against 133,111. Majority for 28,754.

Permitting Lyman Hill to be read by title only, for 145,248; against 112,279. Majority for 31,969.

Increasing number of state senators from 30 to 31, for 88,717; against 183,247. Majority against 94,530.

Regulating commercial fishing in coastal streams, for 196,196; against 101,388. Majority for 94,797.

Old age and disability pension fund, for 86,374; against 244,960. Majority against 158,586.

Basic school support fund, for 157,904; against 151,785. Majority for 6139.

In non-contested offices Rex Putnam for state superintendent of public instruction received 344,268 votes and George Rosman for the state supreme court 237,065. Both Putnam and Rosman were listed as non-partisan.

The 89 marriage license applications issued during November by the Marion county clerk's office exactly equals the license total for October, the clerk's records show.

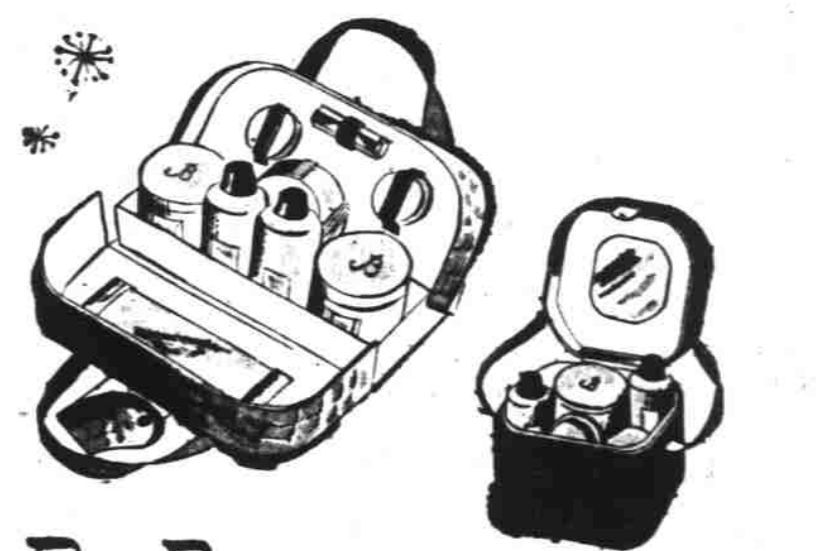
