## LOG HAULING PERMITTED

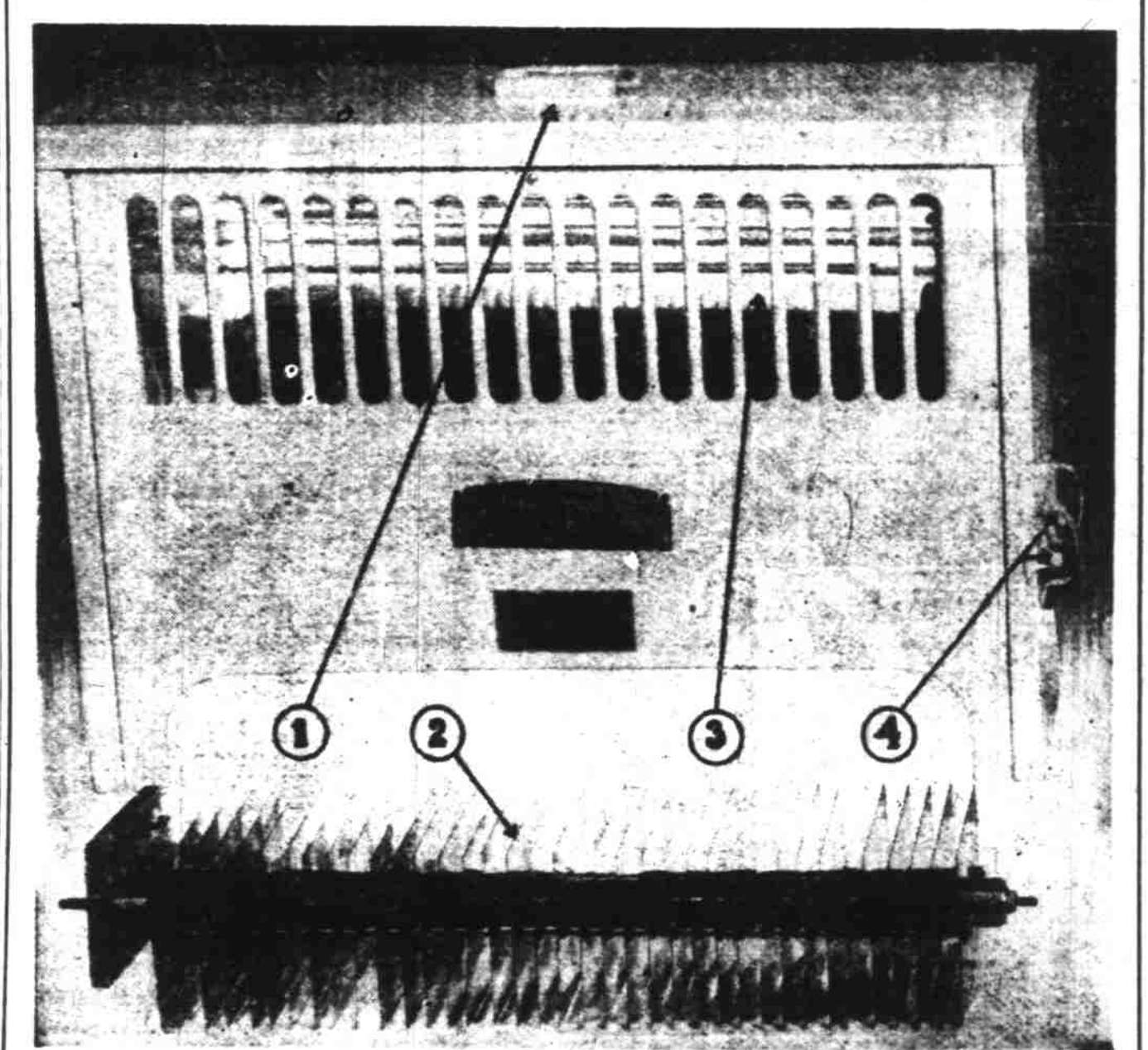
