Draft Trusteeship Voted for 8 Areas By U.N. Committee

LAKE SUCCESS, N. Y., Dec. 12 (AP) The United Nations advanced a step closer to establishment of a trusteeship system for the 15 million inhabitants of areas formerly mandated by the old league of nations with approval last night by a general assembly committee of draft trusteeship agreements for eight territories.

The 54-nation trusteeship committee, by a vote of 35 to 8, approved draft trusteeship agreements for Western Samoa, Ruanda-Urundi, Tanganyika, the British Cameroons, British Togoland, the French Cameroons, French Togoland and New Guinea.

The agreements now go to the floor of the general assembly for final approval.
