Have butter at room temperature, mix with sugar and add flour gradually, warming flour if necessary to work it in. Working on an oven door is good. Use hands and a wooden bowl for ease on mixing. Divide dough in quarters and pat to about 14 inch thick. Cut in fancy shapes, decorate with cake decorations if available. Bake at 300 degrees for 10 or 15 minbeing careful not to ge brown, as this scorches the butter and changes the flavor.


