Oregon Purchases 17,000 Pairs of Shoes For State Institutions

The state of Oregon Tuesday announced the purchase of more than 17,000 pairs of shoes from the war assets administration for use at the Oregon state hospital, state penitentiary and other state institutions. The shoes came from Camp Adair and the purchase will save the taxpayers of Oregon approximately \$30,000 over a period of five years, it was declared. Purchase price was \$3090. The shoes weighed 25 tons.
