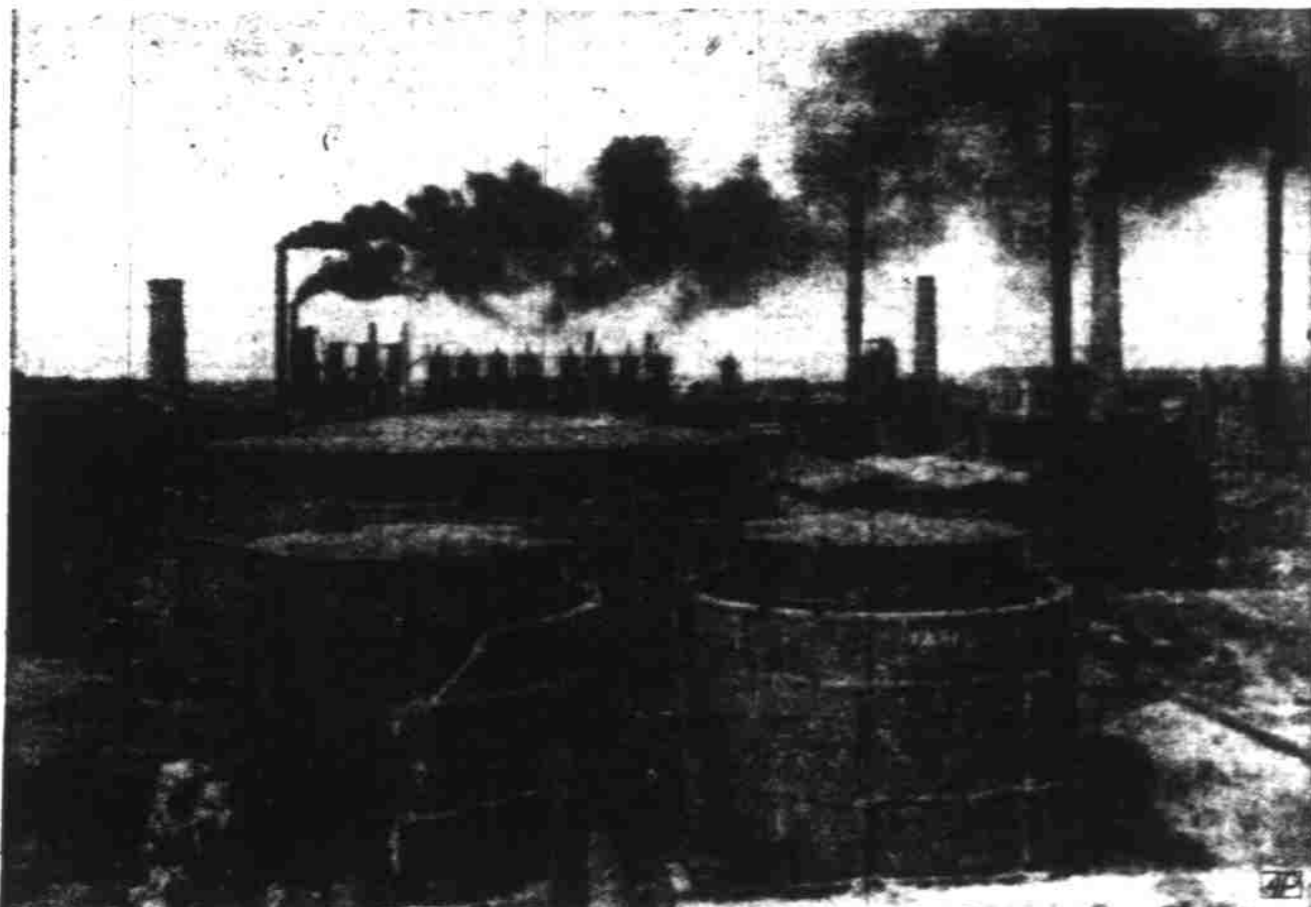


SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 8.—(AP)—This three-masted ship, the Denmark, Danish training ship carrying 115 cadets and 17 officers, crossed in through the Golden Gate today for a week's stay in San Francisco bay. Local Men on Adair Building Buyers' List

Purchase of 12 surplus Camp Adair structures by eight Salem men, among 195 structures recently sold for a total of \$95,278.15, was disclosed yesterday by the Portland headquarters of the war assets administration.

Average sale price was \$488 per building or other structure. WAA said there were 227 bids for the 287 buildings offered for sale after priority groups earlier had had an opportunity to bid. WAA listed the purchasers as follows:

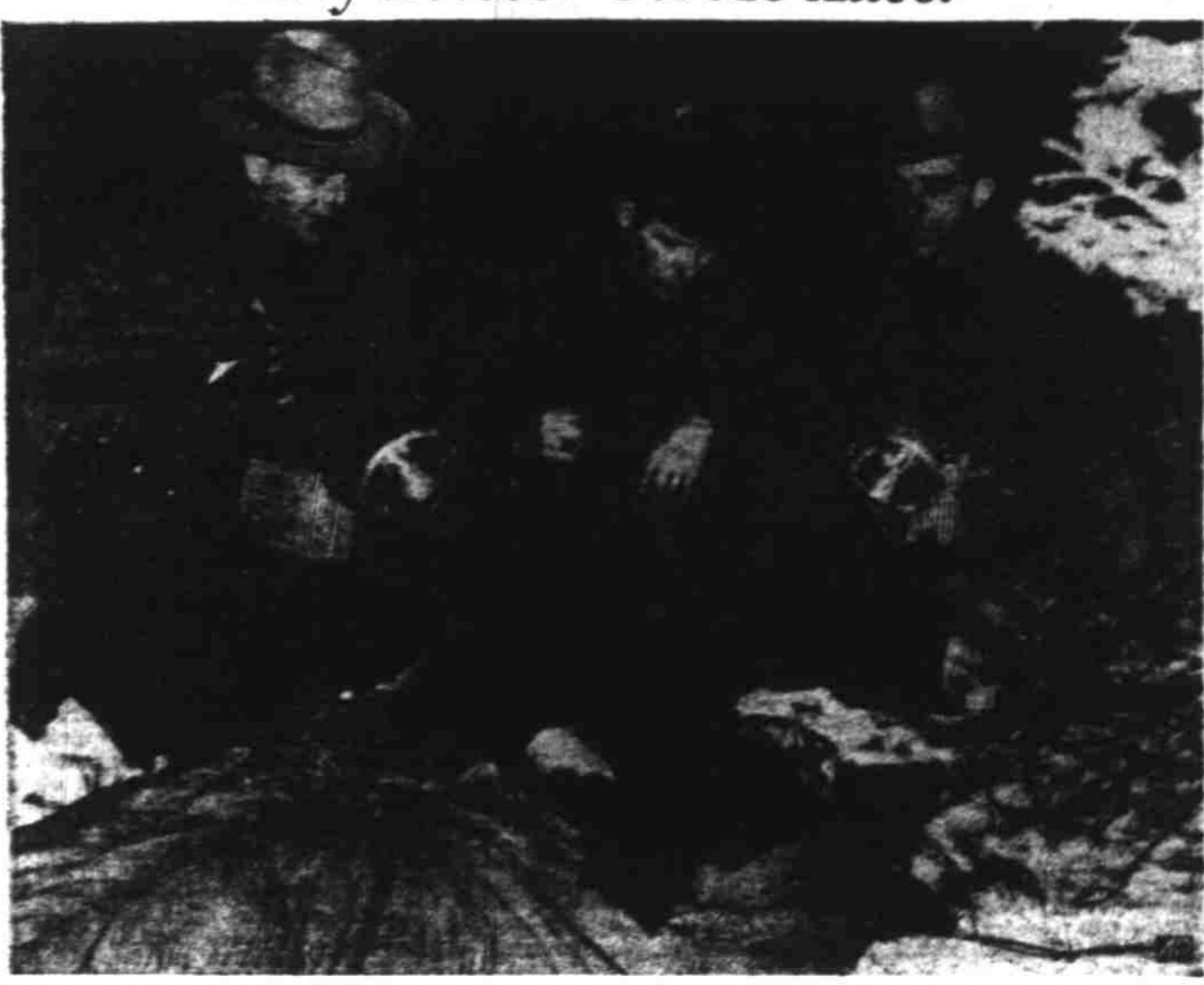
