# Offerings Drop Leading Stocks

NEW YORK, Jan. 15 (AP)—Offerings in the final hour depressed a number of leading stocks fractions to more than 2 points in today's market.

The Associated Press 60-stock composite gave up 4 of a point, dropping to 63.7. Of 905 issues traded, 439 finished lower and 257 advanced. Transfers totaled 770,000 shares against 850,000 on Tuesday.

American Telephone, which reported 1946 earnings equal to \$9.41 a share against \$8.55 in the preceding year, was steadier than most issues but closed off 1/4 at 170 3/4. Western Union "A" dipped 1/2 to 177 1/2, a new 1946-47 low. Schenley resumed its recent decline and was off 3/4 at 43 1/2.

# Grains Move Down Ladder

CHICAGO, Jan. 15 (AP)—Grains moved into lower territory on profit-taking today, only the January corn contract showing resistance to the downward trend.

Wheat closed 1/4-3/8 lower, January \$2.18 1/2, corn was 1/4 lower to 170 3/4, higher, and oats 1/4-3/8 lower, March 77 1/2-77 3/4.

Cash corn offered by the country was moderately large at 200,000 bushels.

The country also offered oats in large quantities, bookings totaling 110,000 bushels. March barley advanced 1/2 cent to \$1.24 1/4.
