

### Senate Action

**DEFEATED:** (Med. exam. dentistry com.) — Increases auto court inspection fees and adds camping spaces to accommodations to be inspected by state board of health.

**PASSED:**

SB 112 — (Adda Rusty, blackbirds and European starlings to birds for which no closed season is declared.)

SB 122 — (Roads and highways com.) — Limits width of trailer coaches put in operation after June 1, 1947 to 102 inches (previous width 108 inches) and limits length of trailer coaches operated within cities to 35 feet.

HB 58 — (Com. on Rev. of laws) — Amends sec. 101-1602 regarding fire insurance policy as clerical change.

**ADOPTED:**

HB 10 — (Mil. and Vet. affairs com.) — Amends law to raise gross earnings of veteran trainees.

HB 11 — (Rep. Wells) — Asking president to make part of Vancouver Barracks a national monument.

SB 228 — (Roads and highways com.) — Declaring ownership by the state of that section of the shore of the Pacific ocean included between the high and low tide lines except where already disposed of, provides for zoning of such areas.

### House Action

**PASSED:**

HB 137 — (Rep. Gallagher) — Provides for brand inspector in 20 eastern Oregon counties and Multnomah to prevent theft; levies 10c a head on Oregon livestock, 5c for that coming into state.

HB 206 — (Rep. Van Dyke) — Provides that estate appraisers shall receive \$3, instead of \$2, as minimum.

HB 229 — (Rep. Schmelzer) — Provides that trucks and trailers must have fenders and mudguards to prevent wheel spray.

HB 344 — (Rep. Dammach) — Raises from \$1,500,000 to \$2,000,000 the amount to be borrowed from irrevocable school fund, and amortized by rents within 30 years, for new state office building.

HB 386 — (Com. on educ.) — Requires state sup. of public instruction to name member of his staff as secretary of state board of education and set up courses for public schools. (Substitutes for HB 232.)

SB 21 — (Roads, highways com.) — Authorizes state highway department to build walks and paths along highways.

SB 25 — (Roads, highways com.) — Increases from \$250,000 to \$700,000 revolving fund of state highway department; reduces liability bond of state highway engineer from \$350,000 to \$200,000 and applies it also to cover subordinates.

SB 96 — (Education com.) — Permits dancing in schools at school-owned buildings and otherwise liberalizes use of such buildings for non-school purposes; allows charge to be made.

SB 181 — (Education com.) — Lets school boards excuse pupils under compulsory attendance age if attendance works hardship on family or is unprofitable to student.

SB 182 — (Municipal aff. com.) — Provides for assessments of property for establishing by cities of off-street parking facilities.

SB 183 — (Municipal aff. com.) — Lets cities acquire private property for off-street parking.

SB 134 — (State affairs com.) — Allows deductions from pay of state employees for group life insurance.

SB 184 — (Rep. of laws com.) — Requires court to name special administrator where necessary for handling estate of decedent.

SB 297 — (Sen. Thompson) — Requires property owners to provide assessor with description of property if larger than quarter section to assist in computing assessment roll.

**DEFEATED:**

SB 185 — (Municipal affairs com.) — Would let cities institute condemnation proceedings to acquire off-street parking facilities.
