### Stocks Show Slow Upturn

NEW YORK, Feb. 27—(AP)—Stocks generally enjoyed a recovery push in today's market although the speed which accompanied the recent decline was lacking. Gains ranged from fractions to a point or so with assorted favorites up around 4. Top marks were trimmed in most cases at the close. Steels, motors, coppers, gold mines, packers, airlines, selected autos and pivotal industrial paced the revival. The Associated Press 60-stock composite was up 7 of a point at 66.5, best upturn since Feb. 7. Of 984 issues appearing, 671 rose and only 157 fell.

### Polk County Vetch Fields Promise Well

George Devey, certification inspector from Oregon State college crops department, has been in Polk county the past week inspecting vetch fields. Devey reports that Russell T. Daulton, assistant county agent, One hundred and fifty Polk county farmers had filed application to have 4000 acres certified. No support price is promised on vetch seed this year. Farmers seeking for inspection are doing so to keep their fields eligible to produce certified seed in case there is a premium price or future need for certified seed. Daulton reports the vetch fields as a whole, in comparison to last year, promise to be a good crop.

### New Strength Seen in Grain

CHICAGO, Feb. 27—(AP)—Strength developed in both wheat and corn on the board of trade today, although new crop deliveries tended to lag behind the advance displayed by old crop contracts. March wheat rose to a new 27-year high at \$2.43. Volume in this delivery is declining. New seasonal highs were made by May wheat and May, July and September corn.

Wheat closed 1/2 to 5 cents higher with March at its \$2.43 peak, best level for any wheat delivery since 1920 when December wheat rose to \$2.75 in July. Corn was 1 1/2-3/4 higher, March \$1.49 1/2-\$1.49 and oats 1/2-1 1/4 higher, March 60 1/4-81.

### Pruning Hints for Fruit Trees Given

Pruning of the many small home orchards throughout the valley should not be neglected by their owners. It is necessary to remove all dead or dying limbs, sucker growth, and overlapping branches that exclude sunlight. A general thinning out of all small limb growth if it is overly thick will prove beneficial by opening up the tree to more air and light. If the tree has become too high for convenient picking, it may be headed back at the top if there is sufficient fruiting growth left in the lower portions to produce a crop. This practice applies mostly to apple and pear trees and to a lesser extent to cherries and peaches, but not to nuts. All pruning must be done with leaving stubs. Pruning cuts over two inches in diameter should be covered by an antiseptic paint. Application of the paint should be delayed for about two weeks or until cuts have dried out.
