Ranch Ramblings By Rural Reporter. Marcus Vetter, Monitor, in a tagging demonstration held in conjunction with the 4-H sheep judging school at Harms Brothers farm, Canby, recently pointed out that with shearing time close at hand, preparation of fleeces for market is of utmost importance in this country at the present time.

Quality wool from New Zealand and Australia offers severe competition to the comparatively lower grade fleeces produced here. He suggests the following points for the improvement of quality in our wool: 1. Sheep should be tagged prior to shearing. Tagging is important in the prevention of disease and helping the lambs to get started. 2. Shearing sheds should be kept clean to reduce stains on the fleeces. 3. Fleeces should be securely tied to prevent falling apart. 4. Use only paper fleece twine for tying. 5. Do not pack wool bags too tightly. This condition gives the impression to the buyer that the wool is of heavy shrinking quality.

Where prunes and plums are showing the first few green tips to the buds, the delayed dormant spray can be applied if thrips are known to be present in the orchard. Lime sulphur can be used, three gallons to 100, plus nicotine sulphate one pint to 100 gallons of water, or 20 per cent DDT in miscible oil, one pint to 100 gallons.
