

Quality wool from New Zealand and Australia offers severe comgrade fleeces produced here. He Girls Tea Hostesses suggests the following points for the improvement of quality in our wool: 1. Sheep should be tagged prior to shearing. Tagging is important in the prevention of disease and helping the lambs to get started 2. Shearing sheds should be kept clean to reduce stains on the fleeces, 3. Fleeces should be securely tied to prevent falling apart. 4. Use only paper fleece twine for tying. 5. Do not pack wool bags too tightly. This condition gives the impression to the buyer that the wool is of heavy shrinking quality.
