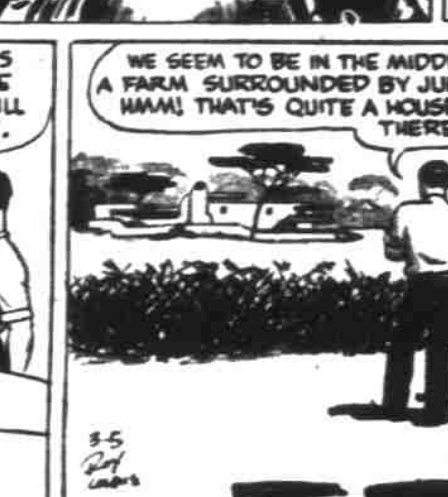

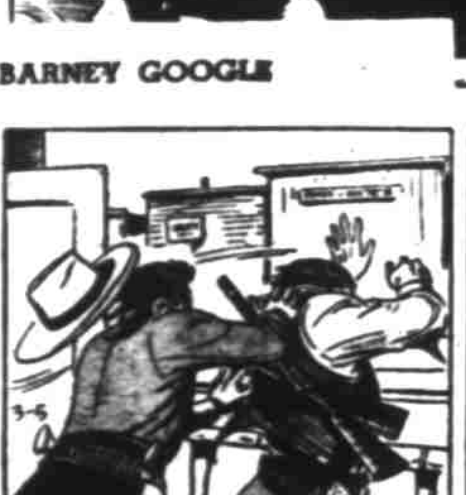

Grain Prices Drop Sharply

CHICAGO, March 4.—(AP)—Grain futures broke sharply on the board of trade today, following last week's advances which established new seasonal highs for both wheat and corn. From the start of the session traders could find nothing of a stimulating nature to peg a rally on, and prices continued to drift downward until near the close when stop loss orders were uncovered. At the close bell wheat was 3 cents to 5 1/2 cents lower than yesterday's finish, March \$2.53 1/2-2 1/4. Corn was 2 1/2 to 3 cents lower, March \$1.54 1/2-1 1/2, and oats were 1/4 to 1 1/2 lower, March 87-87 1/2.
