The lack of vigor on the recent comeback inspired some quick-turn profit taking by professionals who still accounted for the greater part of the volume. Accounts were trimmed also by those who still were bearish over business prospects and the cloudy foreign picture.

Wheat Futures Divided; Oats, Corn Steady

CHICAGO, March 20 (AP)—A two-way market developed in wheat futures on the Board of Trade today when old crop deliveries broke sharply while new crop months held firm. Corn and deferred contracts of oats finished steady after wide price fluctuations.

Grain traders attributed the weakness in old crop wheat to a decline in cash prices at major terminals, as well as a continuation of the profit-taking liquidation which has occurred this

week after the sensational upturn since mid-January. Old crop wheat finished 3 1/2 to 6 cents lower, March \$2.74. New crop deliveries were 1/4 to 2 cents higher, July \$2.20-2.20 1/4. Corn was 1/4-1/2 higher, March \$1.67 1/4-1/2, and oats 2 1/4 lower to 3/8 higher, March 90.

Place, skin-side down, on oiled hot plank or ovenware platter and bake in hot oven (450° F.) for 15 to 30 minutes, basting frequently. Remove from oven, border with Mashed Potatoes, brush with melted butter, milk or diluted egg yolk and brown in oven or under broiler.
