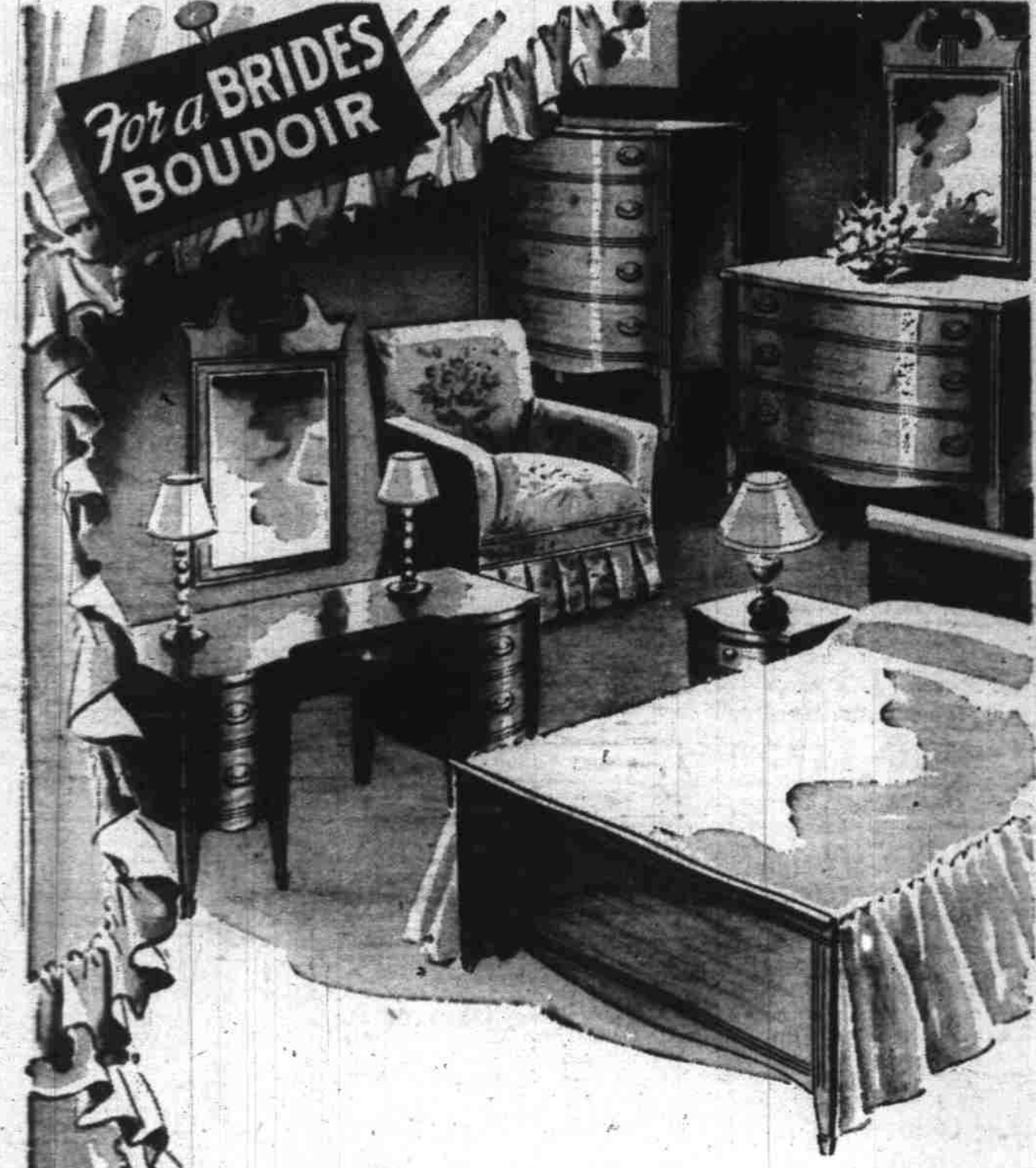
Mrs. Sturdevant was born Nov. 20, 1863. Survivors, the widower, Church Sturdevant of 2505 State st., Salem.
