He suggests planting some of the dwarf species in the rock garden. Rhododendrons must have good drainage, and at least part time shade, says Walter A. Barkus, information committee of the Salem Camellia and Rhododendron society. He adds that a good rule for a person to remember, is the larger the leaves, the more shade they will need.
