Truck Drivers' Traffic Advice In New Booklet

Friendly truck drivers will cease signaling for cars to pass them on the road, if they heed the advice in a 32-page, plain English booklet on "Highway Log Truck Safety" issued this week by Secretary of State Robert S. Farrell, Jr.

"How do you know but that the guy is 'drunker'n a skunk'... Don't stick your neck out," the booklet advises. The phrasing throughout the little publication follows a similar pattern of language—"give the pedestrian a break"; "don't bulldoze your way into a stream of traffic"; "the basic rule is the golden rule for drivers"; "generally be a right guy."

Slate Laws Condensed
Applicable state laws are condensed in the booklet, which also offers advice on handling equipment, loading, coupling, rights-of-way and driving precautions.

The booklet was prepared by Floyd Cook, former highway representative of the Pacific Northwest Loggers' association; Ted Kepner, Crown Zellerbach safety engineer; F. B. Crandall, Oregon highway commission traffic engineer, and Sid King, of the secretary of state's traffic safety division. Art work was done by Robert Evenden, director of accident prevention under the Oregon Industrial Accident commission.

Compared to Power Hammer
Comments include: "A 60-ton power hammer, operated by an expert, can be used to crack the shell of a hard-boiled egg without damaging the egg itself. And a 60,000-pound loaded log truck, operated by an expert, can move through modern congested traffic without scratching a fender."

Workmen this week were pouring cement for the flume forms and the job is expected to be completed soon, he added.
