

Employed Rolls Climb by 200 In County; Cannery Rise Begins

Employment in Marion county continued its seasonal increase, adding 600 workers during April, Salem office of the state employment service reported Monday.

A total of 2400 Salem and county residents were still seeking jobs on May 1, compared with 3,000 at the beginning of April. Present unemployed rolls include 1,000 women and 500 veterans. The Salem office, including itinerant points at Mill City, Silverton and Woodburn, last month processed 10,223 calls, a decrease of about 3,000 from March.

During April employment gains were scored in lumbering, manufacturing, food processing and agriculture. Wholesale and retail trades and service trades showed a decrease in the number of workers employed. While fewer building permits were issued and fewer dwelling units begun during April, total employment in construction contracting registered a slight increase.

Twenty-three new dwelling units, totaling \$116,450, were started over the county during April, 21 fewer than in March.

Supply of some workers such as carpenters and laborers dwindled during April. Many left this area because of the housing shortage and others changed employment.

After reaching a seasonal low in March, employment in canneries began its regular upward

Selling Lowers Stock Leaders

NEW YORK, May 12 (AP)—It was "blue Monday" for the stock market today as leading issues in virtually all departments ran into selling.

The trend was irregularly downward from the start. While assorted favorites managed to emerge with modest improvement, losses of fractions to better than 2 points held a wide majority at the close.

Professionals again accounted for the principal trading and most of these turned somewhat bearish regarding the course of business, tax and labor legislation, wage-price problems and foreign affairs. A little buying here and there was based on earnings, dividends and belief the list may have been oversold. The recently climbing oils ran into profit cashing.

The Associated Press 60-stock composite was off .6 of a point at 61.5, a low since April 29 and the sharpest setback since April 18. Of 905 issues registering, 597 fell and 156 rose.

Rally Brings Grain Gains

CHICAGO, May 12 (AP)—A sharp rally developed in grains during the last 30 minutes of trading on the board of trade today. With the May wheat contract leading, early losses were cancelled and fairly substantial gains substituted in all pits.

Touching off the rally was a dispatch from Washington stating that the commodity credit corporation will not allow any delay in delivering cash wheat owned to the agency. The delivery date is May 31. Some traders had thought it might be postponed to June 30.

Wheat finished 1/4-2 1/2 higher, May \$2.66 1/2-1/4, corn was 1/4-2 1/4 higher, May \$1.69 1/2-1/4, and oats were 1/4-1/2 higher, 93 1/4-1/2. May larid ended 20 cents lower to 15 cents a hundred pounds higher, July \$19.05, after July and September had established new seasonal lows.

AAF to Start Cadet Classes

The war department has announced that applications will now be accepted for the first army air forces aviation cadet pilot training class since VE day. Successful cadets will be commissioned second lieutenants after completion of 52 weeks' training.

Classes are open both to civilians and enlisted men from all components of the army. Age limits are from 18 to 26 1/2 years and applicants are required to have completed two years' college work or to pass a written test measuring the equivalent. Thorough physical and aptitude tests must also be passed for acceptance as cadets.

First classes will start July 1, October 15 and next March 1. Cadets assigned from civilian life who do not complete the course will be discharged.
