The council voted 5 to 3 to consider Thompson's special case and give him necessary authority after City Manager J. L. Franzen explained that Thompson had purchased 800 feet of two-inch water pipe last fall in the understanding that area would join the city or he would get special permission for the water line to enable him to develop a home on his property

The council decision was opposed by Aldermen Gille, Jorgensen and Fry, who expressed the opinion the city should be consistent in its policy.
