

SEATTLE, May 23-(A)-A small fish from Bikini lagoon set a radio-activitiy "meter" clicking wildly at the University of Washington today.

The finny sturgeon, which once took its own picture on an X-ray film, still carries a radio-active "kick" from the algae and other submerine food it consumed after the atomic age-in bomb formcame to the lagoon last summer.

The radio-active fish showed in mild form, said Dr. Stafford Warren, dean of medicine at the University of California at Los Angeles, the contamination which he warned would bring the worldwide disaster in any future atomic
