### Blair in Canton, Ohio, for several years. Music has been his career and he distinguished himself as tenor soloist, performing in opera and singing over the radio. At Canton he and his wife conducted a studio for the teaching of music.

Born in Fossil, Ore., in 1902, Blair graduated from high school in Corvallis and from Oregon State college where he studied voice under Theodore Gaskins and Paul Petri. His talent was recognized and he went east for advanced study at the University of Wisconsin and with private tutors in Chicago and New York. His opera work included engagements with Monte Carlo Grand opera company, Chicago Civic opera, Canadian National, Milwaukee Civic and Thavieus Grand opera. He also did radio work with stations in Cleveland and Columbus.

At Canton he was soloist and member of the quartette at Trinity Reformed church and was conductor of choral groups, besides his work as instructor as instructor in voice. Death came, without warning, from a heart attack while he was teaching.

### Britain May Get Greek Aid Funds

WASHINGTON, May 23—(AP)—Undersecretary of State Dean Acheson disclosed today that some of the dollars going to aid Greece may be spent on British goods, particularly military equipment.

But he ruled out a "kick-back" to the British for the funds they bring into Greece after the March 31 deadline they originally set for their economic withdrawal.

### Payroll Gain Noted

### Boat Season On Willamette Gains Impetus

This week's hot weather has given impetus to the widening local interest in pleasure boating on the Willamette river, and a big boating season lies ahead for this summer, in the opinion of Salem waterfront observers.

As Salem Boat House rushed construction of its second dock and other improvements on the riverfront at the foot of Chemeketa street, some 52 boats already were being kept at the docks there and the first cabin cruiser of the season put in its appearance this week.

Willard D. Taylor, proprietor of the Boat House, Salem's only docking and waterfront boat sales and servicing establishment, estimated interest in boating this year at about five times that in any recent year. He said his firm alone has sold about 200 new boats in the past 14 months.

The new cabin cruiser, first all-metal boat in this area, is the new property of Adolph C. Nelson, Salem business man. The 25-foot craft draws 30 inches of water and will sleep four persons. In anticipation of a busy boating season, Taylor has completed a riverfront drive from Chemeketa to Court street and has undertaken the new dock construction to increase docking capacity to at least 50 boats. A government dock adjacent to the Salem Boat House soon will offer hoisting facilities, Taylor has been informed.

### Atom Bombed Fish Still Radio-Active

SEATTLE, May 23—(AP)—A small fish from Bikini lagoon set a radio-activity "meter" clicking wildly at the University of Washington today.

The finny sturgeon, which once took its own picture on an X-ray film, still carries a radio-active "kick" from the algae and other submarine food it consumed after the atomic age—in bomb form—came to the lagoon last summer.

The radio-active fish showed in mild form, said Dr. Stafford Warren, dean of medicine at the University of California at Los Angeles, the contamination which he warned would bring the worldwide disaster in any future atomic war.

### Political Bars in Bill

WASHINGTON, May 23—(AP)—Bills to bar political broadcasts on election day and the day before and to make other sweeping changes in radio regulations were introduced today by the Republican chairman of the senate and house commerce committees.

### Communists Near Manchuria Capitol

NANKING, May 23—(AP)—American and British consular dependents left Communist-beseiged Changchun in 4 U. S. army plane today, while martial law in Shanghai and Peking failed to halt student strikes and anti-war demonstrations.

With the Communists literally hammering at the gates, Chinese government planes dropped ammunition to the garrison at Changchun, capital city of Manchuria.

### British May Divide India

LONDON, May 23—(AP)—De-spairing of Hindu-Muslim unity, Britain prepared today to divide India's 400,000,000 people into at least two and possibly five separate and independent nations.

British and Indian informants said the cabinet, anticipating failure of a final plea for Indian unity, approved details of an historic partition formula.

Lord Mountbatten, viceroy to India, will place the new British plan before India's political bosses on June 2 in New Delhi.

### Eastern Garden Club Delegates to See Capitol Sunday

Members of the Salem Men's Garden club are urged by President Mark Taylor, to appear at the state house at 10:30 Sunday morning to welcome the delegation which will have lunch here before leaving for Silverton for an inspection of the Cooley gardens and a visit to Silver Creek Falls state park.

Included in the delegation will be amateur gardeners from New York, Philadelphia, Chicago and other eastern and middle western cities.

### Profit Cashing Slows Stocks

NEW YORK, May 23—(AP)—Stocks were restrained by profit cashing today although offerings were exceptionally light and a little further short covering, together with timid investment buying, kept many leaders in the plus column.

The Associated Press 60-stock composite was up 2 of a point at 60.3, its fifth successive upturn.

Brightening prospects for sugar supplies lifted Coca-Cola 6 points to 151 and Pepsi-Cola 1 1/2 to 29 1/2. Cheering dividends put up Spalding 1 1/2 at 17 1/2, General Refractories 1 1/2 at 20 1/2, Inspiration Copper 1/2 at 14 1/2, and National Supply 1/2 at 14 1/2.

### Grain Market Price Rise

CHICAGO, May 23—(AP)—All grains spurred on the Board of Trade today, reflecting strength in the cash markets. Export houses and elevators took to the buying side and there was a persistent demand coming through commission houses.

Wheat closed 2 1/2 and 3 cents higher, July \$2.34 1/2-1/2, corn was 1/4-1/2 cents higher, July \$1.74 1/2-1/2, and oats were 1/4 to 3 cents higher, July \$8 1/2-1/2. Lard for July delivery finished at \$19.80.
