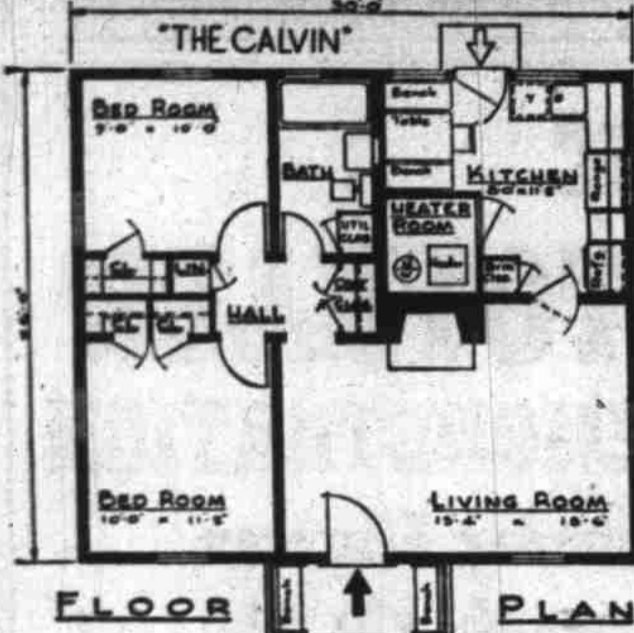

### New Livestock Brand Law to Slow Rustlers

Oregon's gasoline cowboys, or cattle rustlers using modern forms of transportation, are going to find it more difficult to operate under plans being made by the state department of agriculture, which is armed with a new law putting teeth in the state's livestock theft and brand inspection laws.

No one knows how extensive rustling is today, the principal reason being that a livestock owner often cannot tell whether his stock is lost, dead or stolen. The owner might have 500 calves, and then have only 450 when he rounds them up. If he reports the loss, the state police and department of agriculture try to find them. But the officers say livestock theft is the hardest crime to detect because it has been relatively easy to dispose of stolen animals, as they are sold far from the scene of the crime.

Effective July 5

The new law, which goes into effect July 5, will make it harder to sell stolen animals.

Last year state police made only 11 arrests for livestock theft, and 39 arrests for technical violations of the livestock inspection and brand inspection laws. But they say those are only a small percentage of the actual number of thefts.

The department of agriculture is compiling its new brand book, containing all of the 12,000 to 15,000 livestock brands in the state. This also will make it easier to control theft.

Applies to Cattle Movement

The new law applies to movement of cattle, horses and mules,

and sets up a state brand inspection area consisting of all Eastern Oregon counties and Multnomah, Jackson and Josephine counties. Also included are public livestock markets.

Livestock moved by truck and trailer from any point within the area to an open market area must be accompanied by a transportation certificate showing brands, marks and other identifications.

Violators of the new law are subject to maximum penalty of \$500 fine and six months in jail.

### Heart Disease Unaffected by Light Smoking

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., June 12—(AP)—Moderate smoking is okay for "most patients" suffering from heart disease—despite a common medical view to the contrary—the American Medical association was told today.

"In fact, for many," said Dr. Robert Levy of New York, "smoking not only affords pleasure but aids in promoting emotional stability."

But smoking should be forbidden, he said, for patients afflicted with the acute, active forms of cardiac malady—congestive heart failure, rheumatic heart disease, and acute cardiac infarction, a condition in which there is destruction of heart tissue due to circulatory failure.

Despite the common practice of doctors "to advise cardiac patients to abstain from the use of tobacco," Levy declared, it has been the experience of himself and a group of colleagues "over a period of years, that most patients with a cardiac disorder, including those with disease of the coronary arteries, can smoke moderately without apparent harm."

### Flood Control Discussed at Lions Lunch

Willamette valley flood control and related engineering projects were outlined Thursday noon before Salem Lions club by Col. O. E. Walsh, district engineer of Portland.

The colonel told the Marion hotel luncheon group that the present \$315,000,000 plan to improve flood control, drainage, irrigation and navigation has grown out of the 1938 flood control act plan which envisioned only seven reservoirs and some bank protection work. He said now the 15 to 18 dams contemplated would create 2,700,000 acre feet of water storage, bank protection projects at 167 sites total 42 miles, drainage projects would benefit at least 150,000 acres and permit more extensive navigation.

The Lions club also conducted a presentation ceremony in honor of Hilda Fox, Salem high school graduate of last week who was awarded the club's first \$300 scholarship for prospective teachers.

Forgue Taken To State Prison

R. N. Forgue, West Salem, was taken to the state prison Thursday by Marion county sheriff's deputies to serve an 18-months sentence meted out by Circuit Judge E. M. Page on a charge of contributing to the delinquency of a minor.

Forgue also was given a suspended sentence of three months in the county jail on a charge of larceny of a pistol. He pleaded guilty to both charges. He was arrested earlier this week by city police in West Salem, where, the complaint charged, he was living with a minor girl.
