Mail Service

Assurance of Postmaster Al Gragg that suspension of house delivery of mail on Saturday will not recur is good news. It was annoying to many residents to miss the delivery last Saturday. This was attributed to lack of funds. Perhaps it was due to lack of proper budgeting of funds. Whatever the cause the complaints received indicated that the people expect and want Saturday mail service.

The postal system is essentially a service institution, and when performance is built up to certain levels the public is critical if the service deteriorates. It does not seem that the postal system locally or nationally has regained the standards it attained in prewar days, in promptness of dispatch and delivery of mails. With improved pay, employment conditions should attract and hold competent workers and with proper organization, and stimulation of effort old standards should be gained and passed.

In the business of communication there is always a driving urgency: "The mail must go through." Hence there should be no slackening of performance in this important public service.

Picking a Queen

To Sid Stevens and his gang who are in the throes of picking a Cherry Festival queen we pass on this item from Art Perry's column in the Medford Mail-Tribune:

The next thing on the civic agenda in many towns is the nominating and electing of Fourth of July queens and princesses. They will reign throughout the three-day celebration of a one-day event. What the country needs is an old-fashioned "Goddess of Liberty," garbed in robes of flowing white and able to balance herself on a soap-box, firmly nailed to the floor of a hay-wagon, drawn by a prancing span of horses with red, white and blue ribbons entwined in their braided tails.

The Oregon Journal's editorial cartoon of Monday shows the state ledger open, with a big blob of red ink on one side, on the other, as an alternative, the sales tax. The cartoon is ingenious but not ingenious. According to figures worked out in the closing days of the legislature, the tax program to become effective if the sales tax is defeated will produce more revenue for the state than the sales tax. The real issue in the sales tax election is whether the sales tax shall be invoked as a source of revenue, to the further relief of income and property taxpayers. It is not correct to refer to it as the only alternative to a state deficit in the coming biennium.

After the robbery of the bank at Oakland, Ore. we offered the comment that it was a professional job and ventured the prediction the men would be picked up sooner or later. Now three men have been arrested in Steamboat Springs, charged with another robbery in Roseburg, but suspected of the Oakland job. The FBI has been tracing the men across the country and when they got together nabbed them. Of course their guilt is not yet determined, but the sleuths of the law evidently have connected them with the bank robbery. How do they do it—that's their trade.

The stirrings of a new life are evident in the Santiam country. Already, the rough materials for the new town of Mongold are being laid out. Only a few years remain before the present town of Detroit will be under scores of feet of water. But in those years residents of the high country will have plenty of time and opportunity to find their stake and a new homestead. The beauty of the country is too general for a single project to discourage those who revere it.

The senate did better by the Columbia basin project and Bonneville power administration, lifting appropriations for the former by nearly \$9 million and for the latter for construction a little over that amount. Now if the vengeful house doesn't whack the increases the region will fare pretty well for the construction of important projects.

In Szeged, Hungary several hundred citizens met to determine whether there was freedom of speech and assembly in Hungary. They were set upon by 150 communists armed with weighted rubber hose, brass knuckles and hatchet-like "fokos." At least they got the answer to their question.

The engineers who declare it is feasible to pipe Columbia river water to arid Southern California may be somewhat like the architect whose enthusiasm for the magnificent led him to design a \$50,000, 10-bedroom home for a \$200-a-month salaried man with a wife and one child.

Anyone who questions the practical approach of public school teachers might cogitate on the case of Mrs. Werdna Wyatt of Springfield who is taking three of her Spanish-language pupils on a two-months visit to Mexico.

An airline official says if plane passengers were seated backward they could withstand the shock of stopping a 200-mile speed in nine feet. These rocky mountain tops don't bend nine feet, however.

Another Klamath Falls man has failed to show up after a lake fishing trip. His overturned boat was found however. Nature plays mean tricks on lakes and rivers, which is a good point for summer vacationists to remember.

KEEPING THE PEACE

At the 51st commencement of the United States Military Academy at West Point, N. Y., Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower told the 310 graduates that "war is mankind's most tragic and stupid folly." He added: "The true soldier of America, therefore, is a leader for world cooperation. He knows that to serve best the security of his country, he must work for the cause of peace." This security, the general said, is possible through preparedness. In other words, Gen. Eisenhower and other government advocates of sound defense strength, look upon the military and armament equipment as tools whereby peace can be enforced. It is the same idea which moves municipalities to have the best possible police and fire protection. Lawlessness and conflagration both must be checked before they can gain headway. As Pearl Harbor so tragically taught, weapons and personnel must be at hand and ready to stop desperados and to stem future holocausts. There is no magic way to peace. It must be prepared for.
