CHICAGO, June 20 (AP)—Profiting today on the Board of Trade, July corn had established a record high for any corn future at \$2.00-05.
 Attention was centered on corn throughout the session. After opening lower, July ran up to its peak within the first hour. Thereafter, the trend was downward. Previous high for any corn delivery in the board's 99 year history was \$1.99 1/2 in 1918.
 Wheat closed 1 1/2-1/2 lower. July \$2.15 1/4-1/2, corn was 1 1/4-3/4 lower, July \$1.97-1.97 1/2, and oats were 1 to 1 1/4 lower, July 95 1/2-95.

Stocks Stage Modest Rally

NEW YORK, June 20 (AP)—The stock market finished its week today with a modest rally in the face of the labor bill veto.
 The Associated Press 60-stock composite climbed 2 1/2 points to 64.1 and on the week was ahead 8 points. Total transfers of 1,130,000 shares were the best since June 11 and compared with 1,010,000 Thursday. Of 983 issues registering, 581 advanced and 221 declined.
 Extending its rebound from Thursday's low for the year, American Telephone finished 2 1/2 higher at 154 1/2. New 1947 highs were touched on fractional climbs by Shell Union Oil and United Fruit. Bethlehem moved ahead 1 1/2 to 85. Youngstown Sheet 1 1/2 to 63 1/2. International Minerals 3 to 40 1/2, and American Distillers 1 to 31. Packard added 1/2 to close at 5 1/2.
 Phosphate deposits near Charleston, S. C., were the original basis for the commercial fertilizer industry in the United States.
