WALDO HILLS — Mrs. Enid Hearst of Albany and Tom Allen of Salem won the awards as the best-dressed riders at the annual Trail's Ride breakfast Sunday at Waldo Hills club house, sponsored by the Silverton Saddle club.

Awards were made by Harry Carson, master of ceremonies, at the meadow roundup after breakfast. Other awards included those to Fred Annundson, president, and his group from Salem as the largest number present from any club; Nancy Gabbard, 7, from Albany, and Ronnie Pitney, 9, from Silverton, as the two youngest riders; W. J. Stevens, 75, from Mt. Angel, as the oldest man on horseback, and Mrs. Bernice Summer, Salem, as the oldest feminine rider present; and to the Brownsville Foot Hill riders as the group coming the longest distance.

From the meadow roundup, the group swung into its 3 1/2-hour trial ride up the Drift Creek canyon, returning to the club house for sandwiches and coffee.

A total of 157 horse lovers, many of them sons and daughters of the Waldo Hills pioneers, gathered for breakfast, and 133 made the trail ride.

Clubs represented were from St. Paul, Brownsville, Molalla, Portland, Salem, Jefferson, Sheridan, Sublimity, Milwaukie, Lyons, Albany and Silverton. Western string music was provided by the Oregon Trail Riders orchestra from Aurora.

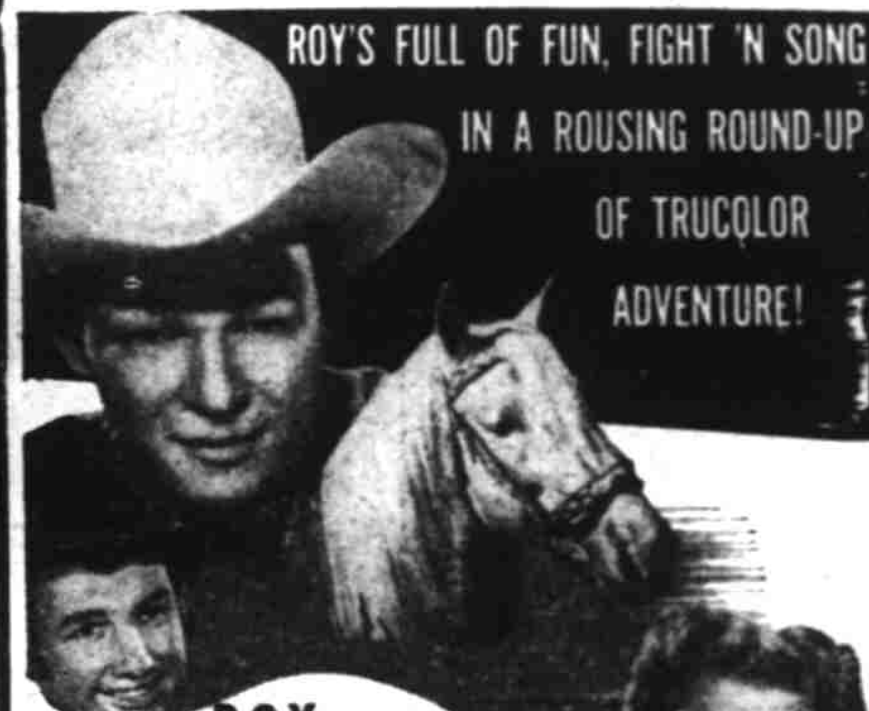
