Saturday Voiselle tossed a six-hitter at the Brooklyn Dodgers and knocked the Bums out of first place as the Braves won 4 to 1. It was Voiselle's second straight win in Boston uniform.

The New York Giants stayed in the thick of the senior circuit scrap by whitewashing Philadelphia 4 to 0. Clint Hartung hurled the shutout, his fifth win and John Mize socked homer number 23 to make it 16 games in a row the New Yorkers have had at least one circuit rout.

Cincinnati beat St. Louis 7 to 5 and Chicago edged Pittsburgh 4 to 2.

The New York Yankees got a three-hit job from rookie Frank Shea, his 11th win against two losses, as they topped Philadelphia 5 to 1.

Chicago edged Cleveland 7 to 6. Detroit and St. Louis were rained out.
