

Democrats to Defy Ruling

BEND, July 11—(AP)—Byron G. Carney, state chairman of the democratic state central committee, declared today that Oregon democrats would not reorganize their committee.

Rex Kimmell, first assistant attorney general in Oregon, had said in an informal opinion that a new committee to drag out the central committee would require central and legislative approval.

"We are not going to put anyone off the democratic central committee," Carney told democrats here. He charged that such a change would place control in the hands of too few persons.

ST. GEORGE, Utah, July 11—(AP)—A woman whose body was found in Zion National park a week ago was identified today as Evelyn Frances Callahan, about 27, Sheriff Antone B. Prince reported.

The young woman died from a bullet wound, and coroner's jury ruled there was foul play.

Prince said Miss Callahan was employed by the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph company in Seattle, Wash., and later for the same company in Portland.

A check of the company's records in Portland showed a Miss Callahan resigned June 5, saying she was going to her home at Eugene, Ore.

Alaska Fire Jumps River

ANCHORAGE, Alaska, July 11—(AP)—The forest blaze which has blackened 250,000 acres on the Kenai peninsula jumped the Kenai river and can be stopped by "nothing now but the waters of Cook inlet — or winter," Pilot Dick Miller said yesterday.

Miller, who has been patrolling the blaze, said the flames were advancing slowly toward the town of Kenai, now ten miles from the fireline.

Army officials directing the fire fighters asked today for additional planes and more men. Additional equipment was to be flown to the scene tomorrow if needed.

The blaze, Miller reported June 7, has destroyed half of a large moose reserve on the peninsula.

WASHINGTON, July 11—(AP)—Admiral Chester Nimitz said today foot soldiers will play as large a part in the next war as ships or airplanes because "the ground soldier must go in to hold the ground."

The chief of naval operations told a senate armed services subcommittee he does not think, therefore, that any future war will be fought primarily on the sea or in the air.
