## GOP Nine Edges Demos, 16-13, With Late Rally

WASHINGTON, July 12—(AP)—Sparked by a pint-sized 200-foot home run by Rep. Glenn Davis (R-Wis.), the republicans won the Congressional baseball game today, 16-13.

The republican landslide came in the fifth. They went into that inning trailing, 7-11. But Rep. Jackson (R-Calif.) whacked out a single that brought in a couple of runs.

Then Davis, who has been a congressman for only three months, strode to the plate with two men on.

The fellow on the loudspeaker reminded the crowd that whoever got the longest blow in this inning would win a washing machine, gift of a local electrical firm.

Undoubtedly thinking of Monday's wash, Davis laid into one.

As it floated out over second, in came Rep. Cooley (D-N.C.), who had been stationed in center-field. Cooley and the ball passed each other without so much as a nod of recognition about 150 feet from home plate.

Davis puffed around third as if he had that water tied to one foot, but he made it and the republicans were ahead for keeps and the 2,000 fans, contributing to a local police boys' fund, had their biggest thrill.

Just to show you what kind of game it was, twice runners stole bases only to find them occupied already. And anyone who gently tapped the ball was quite likely to be safe—at second base.

The umpires had the right idea. Rep. Albert (D-Okla.), who is 5 feet 6 and weighs 130, showed up in a policeman's cap and badge, wearing a six-shooter.

And even Rep. Stockman (R-Ore.), who is 6 feet 6, weighs 260 and is big enough to fill a telephone booth with Albert left over, carried a shotgun. No use taking chances.

The game literally ended with a bang. It was early in the seventh, storm clouds were rolling across, when suddenly a thunder-clap hit — apparently about 30 feet above Griffith field. By unanimous consent the ball game was over.

### Zale-Graziano Scrap Tossup

CHICAGO, July 12—(AP)—Champion Tony Zale and Challenger Rocky Graziano, the latter snarlingly confident that "no punch in the belly's gonna stop me this time," today ended heavy preparations for their second middleweight title scrap at the Chicago stadium Wednesday night.

Tabbed as the fight of the year, the eagerly-awaited brawl is likely to produce a \$485,000 gate, tops for that weight bracket, from a capacity crowd of 20,048. The match is generally predicted to be a repetition of their September slugfest in New York when groggy, battered Zale kayoed Graziano in the sixth round.

### Champs Still Ahead, Inverness

## Despite Loss, Demaret And Hogan Retain Lead

TOLEDO, O., July 12—(AP)—Defending Champions Ben Hogan and Jimmy Demaret suffered their first defeat in five matches today, losing one up to National Open Champion Lew Worsham and Johnny Palmer, but they clung to the lead for the top prize of \$2,000 in the Inverness best-ball matches with a "plus 13" score.

That gave them a five-point edge over Ellsworth Vines, former amateur and professional tennis champion, and Clayton Heafner, the huge blond from Charlotte, N. C., who surged to a six-up victory over former National open kings Lawson Little and Lloyd Mangrum.

With the final two matches in the \$10,000 best ball classic due tomorrow, it looked like a fight right down to the wire. Hogan-Demaret are favored to repeat since they meet two of the second division twosomes while Vines and Heafner must dispose of Ed Furgol, the sensational Pontiac, Mich., youth with the rigid withered left arm, and his partner, George Schoux of San Francisco, who are in third place after playing the tourney's most sensational golf.

The Vines-Heafner duo has a "plus 8" rating after winning four matches and losing a four-down decision to Demaret-Hogan, while Furgol-Schoux have "plus 7," despite a three-down defeat at the hands of the leaders. Worsham-Palmer are next with plus one, having won three matches by a single hole, and losing two by the same margin.
