### Gardening Today

As we go into the last half of July we also go into the canning-pruning season in the small home garden. Even if your raspberries are overbearing, you should remove all wood which has borne the current crop as it completes ripening the last fruit. Your ever-bearers will produce longer and much better fruit this way.

**Questions and Answers**  
F.S.E. asks what causes iris to spot and brown.  
Ans.: Probably leaf spot disease. Cut foliage back and burn. Also pick up dried leaves and burn. Is drainage good? This is essential to iris.

**G.K.O. wants to know why peony didn't bloom.** Has been growing in one location for four years. This year produced enclosed buds but they didn't open.  
Ans.: Plants may be set too deep. In heavy soil, crown buds should be no deeper than 1 or 1 1/2 inches below surface of soil. In lighter soils they may be down to 2 or 2 1/2 inches. Topdress with bonemeal mixed with compost. Botrytis blight, if there are other peonies around, may also be the cause, though this seldom attacks new plantings. In the late fall, Garden Club.
