PORTLAND, July 12 (AP)—Wheat trading started from a quiet week when prices advanced 8 cents a bushel toward the end of the period, the U. S. department of agriculture reported today.

The weekly grain review said growers were asking about \$2.00 net for soft white and ordinary hard red winter wheat. Some grain sold at that rate.

The new crop appeared to have an unusually high protein content, the USDA said. Most shipments received here have soft federation type.
