

## Retired Salem Firemen Given Service Badges

Presentation of four service badges was made Thursday night at a special program held in the central fire station attended by all city firemen off duty, and City Manager J. L. Franzen, Fire Chief W. P. Robie and Deputy State Fire Marshal Jack Hays.

Badges were presented by Battalion Chief Robert Mills to Harry (Buck) Hutton, retired fire chief and Charles V. Faulkner, retired fireman at the station last night and are to be presented later to William Iwan, retired assistant chief, now ill at Salem General hospital and to Frank A. Zierbert, retired fireman, now ill at home.

The presentations were followed by City Manager Franzen explaining the new police-fire radio system which he said would probably be ready for operation next week and which he proclaimed to be the most modern and complete fire communication system in this vicinity.

**Fire Aid Communication**  
He explained that when the system is put into full operation it will facilitate communication with 22 units within the city and has accommodations for communication with 15 units outside the city. Communication, at present, he said, will be limited to police, fire and first aid equipment operating in Salem and West Salem but that

continued interest of surrounding communities will eventually bring its usefulness within the scope of many of the cities of both Marion and Polk counties.

**Told of Texas City**  
Jack Hays, deputy state fire marshal recounted recent survey experiences at Texas City, Tex., after the disaster there and commended City Manager Franzen on the installation "of as complete and modern a city communication system as there is in the state of Oregon."

Fire Chief Robie acted as master of ceremonies for the program, which was concluded by entertainment by Jack Spong, magician, movies shown by Sgt. Jack Riddle of the local army reserve and refreshments.

## Upstaters Out In Tournament

PORTLAND, July 24-(P)—Two more upstate teams met first-round defeat tonight in the Oregon semi-pro baseball tournament. Kool Spot of Portland downed Toledo, 4-0, and the Portland Babes measured Hood River, 6-0. Tight pitching featured the contest. Don Wright of Kool Spot shut out Toledo with three hits, but his mates could get only six off Bennett. Dunn of the Babes gave up only two hits, while his rival—Don O'Leary—yielded only three to the victors.

## 2 Perish as Speeding Car Misses Curve

PORTLAND, July 24-(P)—A car carrying two Idaho Falls vacationers and a Portland man careened off a boulevard here today, killing two men and seriously injuring a third.

Delaine Bennett, 30, Idaho Falls, the driver, was found dead beside the wrecked car which piled up in a gravelled field early this morning. Cloyd M. Hammond, 26, Portland, died en route to a hospital.

The third occupant, Merle Brody, 32, who had driven here with Bennett from their home in Idaho Falls, was taken to a hospital with serious head injuries. Police said the Idaho-licensed car went out of control at a curve, skidded 230 feet on the pavement, plumed off the road, and skidded 172 more feet in gravel before crashing into a telephone pole and coming to rest on its side.

## McNary Dam to Prove No Barrier to Celilo Indians

John Whiz of the Celilo tribal council was in Salem Thursday. Noting the press report of an effort of Nez Perce Indians in Idaho to halt construction of McNary dam, Whiz asserted that they had no rights that would be violated by building of this dam. Indians who fish at Celilo are not opposed to the McNary dam above Umatilla, he said, but do object to a dam at The Dalles which would flood their ancient fishing grounds.

## Bluebacks Aplenty

PORTLAND, July 24-(P)—Blueback salmon, crossing Bonneville dam more thickly than ever before, have far outstripped all previous highs. A total of 158,732 bluebacks passed the ladders from January 1 to July 23—nearly 10,000 more than the number to cross during the entire best previous year.

## Mrs. Pankratz, Ex-West Salem Resident, Dies

Elizabeth Pankratz, 77, former resident of 1254 Third st., West Salem, died Thursday morning, July 17, at a hospital at Devils Lake, N. D., according to word received here Thursday.

She was born in southern Russia on Nov. 24, 1869 and emigrated to the U. S. with her parents when 8 years old. The family settled in Nebraska and she married Jacob Pankratz there. He died May 12, 1943. She had later come to Salem to be with the children here and had only recently gone to North Dakota to visit her daughters and a son.

C., Sarah Koehn, Herbert, Sask., and Catherine Rohn, Aisen, N. D. and also by 28 grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.

Funeral services will be held Sunday afternoon at the Memorial church in Aisen, N. D.

## Navy Medals Arrive Here

Medals earned by U. S. navy men during the war are now ready for distribution in the Salem area, officials of the U. S. navy recruiting substation announced Thursday. During the war ribbons in lieu of the actual medals were given to decorated servicemen.

First group distribution of medals here will be accomplished at a meeting of the Beaver Navy post 7775, Veterans of Foreign Wars, at 8 p.m. Tuesday, August 5, in VFW hall, according to the recruiting office plan. Any ex-navy man or woman entitled to a medal may receive it by presenting his original discharge papers at the meeting, it was announced.

## Indonese to Turn Guerrilla

BATAVIA, Java, July 24-(P)—The powerfully-equipped Dutch army in four days of mobile warfare apparently has won its campaign for control of Java's strategic areas—but in mountain and village strongholds the Indonesians planned tonight for another kind of resistance—guerrilla fighting.

Unable to match their equipment against the tanks and aircraft of the Dutch, the Indonesians now were discussing how to conduct a fight in which snipers and spears might play a more important part than armored cars and planes. President Soekarno declared in a radio address, "Let each home, each river, each forest be the stronghold of your defense."

## Steel Prices Start New Rise

MIDDLETOWN, O., July 24-(P)—Charles R. Hook, president of the American Rolling Mill company, said tonight that Armco today increased basic prices on its two finished steel products by \$6 and \$7 a ton.

Hook said that hot rolled steel now was priced at \$56 a ton compared with the former \$50 a ton figure and that cold rolled steel prices henceforth would be \$71 a ton against the former price of \$64.

The price increases were the first actually established in the steel industry since the recent coal strikes.

## Train Passengers Await Vaccination As Smallpox Found

LOS ANGELES, July 24-(P)—A smallpox patient has been removed from a westbound Santa Fe passenger train at Clovis, N.M., and all passengers and crew members are to be detained aboard until they can be vaccinated upon their arrival here tomorrow, city health officials announced tonight.

Dr. H. C. Pully, chief assistant city health officer said all persons not vaccinated by the time the train is due here at 11 a.m. are to be held aboard until the operation is completed. Any who refuse the vaccination, Dr. Pully said, are to be quarantined for 14 days of observation.

The patient is a Negro waiter in the train's diner. The train has five carloads of delegates en route to a west coast convention of Lions clubs International.
