NEW YORK, July 25 (AP)—When a baseball player clouts a home run, it's his, and not even an umpire can deprive him of his prize. That, in effect, was the ruling of President Ford Frick of the National League today as he threw out Brooklyn's hotly-disputed 3-to-2 victory over the St. Louis Cardinals last Sunday at Ebbets field and ordered the game to be replayed as part of a doubleheader on Aug. 18. In finding that Ron Northey, pudge St. Louis outfielder, had indeed been prevented from scoring an inside-the-park home run in the ninth inning by the action of Umpire Beans Reardon in telling him to "slow down," the league president said he was basing his decision on "fairness, common sense and sportsmanship."
