Hearing on a writ of mandamus in a suit to collect refunds on 1942 Oregon income taxes, which was filed in Marion county circuit court recently by six California individuals, was postponed Monday from yesterday to September 4 by Circuit Judge George Duncan.

The hearing was postponed on stipulation of the parties. The suit seeks to compel the state to refund \$568 to each plaintiff on taxes allegedly paid on income earned in Oregon on construction work at Camp Adair.

The plaintiffs are Elmer J. Freethy, James E. Roberts and E. H. Moore and their wives. The three men comprised the partnership of Moore, Roberts and Freethy. They paid taxes, according to the complaint, on income of \$192,308. Following renegotiation of their government contract, the complaints continue, their profits were reduced, and now they seek refunds.

Police Assign New Officers

More than 50 new state police officers who recently completed a training period at the Oregon Vocational school at Klamath Falls were being assigned Monday to various state police districts where they will receive further instruction in police operations.

Thirteen have been assigned to the state police department game division in compliance with a request of the state game commission.

An additional 30 new state police officers will enter the vocational school within two or three weeks. Employment of the new officers was made possible under a law of the 1947 legislature transferring an additional \$1,000,000 of state highway funds to the state police department.

M. L. Jones, 95, Leaves Hospital

M. L. Jones, nearly 95 years of age and an Oregon pioneer, was released Monday from a Salem hospital where he received treatment for pneumonia. Jones lives with two daughters at 2887 Westover rd. in Portland.

Truck-Pole Crash Disrupts Power To Independence

Power service on a 60,000-volt Mountain States Power company main line to Independence was disrupted Monday afternoon when a large Armour company meat truck, driven by Howard Ralph Harrison, Portland, struck a pole after leaving the road on the Independence cutoff about a half mile south of Brunk's corner, state police reported.

Harrison suffered a bumped nose and cut finger, after the tie-rod on the truck dropped and caused the front wheels to lock, police said. The truck jumped over a 50-foot bank, hit the pole and came to a stop on its side, according to police, but neither driver nor truck was hurt by the falling high-voltage lines.

Power company officials said they hoped to have service restored early this morning.

Morris Named Professor at Willamette U

Dr. J. Russell Morris, now completing his work for his doctor's degree at Stanford university, has been appointed assistant professor of education for the ensuing year, Dr. G. Herbert Smith, Willamette university president, announced Monday.

Dr. Morris will succeed Dr. Robert Lantz, who resigned from Willamette in June to be superintendent of the Woodburn public schools. Dr. Morris is a graduate of San Francisco State college, and before entering the army had taught in grade and high schools and was a high school principal. Mrs. Morris is the daughter of Dr. A. C. Roberts, former president of San Francisco college.

President Smith said he is still in need of three houses for faculty members with families. He also has requested that those having housing facilities for students for the fall semester notify the Willamette university registrar's office.

Garbage Pickup System Sought; City Buys Dump

Plans for a garbage collection system in northern Marion county took a boost Monday when the county court paid for and acquired complete title to a dump site.

The court paid \$2,500 to G. C. Baker for a 13-acre tract about two miles northwest of Woodburn. The court is now negotiating with a view to leasing the operation of the system to a private firm.

The group included J. M. Devers, state highway commission attorney; G. S. Paxson, state bridge engineer; H. G. Smith, construction engineer, and E. A. Collier, maintenance engineer.

Wildlife Group Plans Valley Club Council

Formation of a Willamette river council of Oregon Wildlife federation clubs became a strong possibility as a result of a meeting of the federation in Taft over the weekend.

James Loder of Salem, president of the state federation, presided over the quarterly meeting. Loder is a director of the Salem chapter of the Izaak Walton league, and is also an appointee on an interim committee on wildlife set up by the 1947 legislature.

In referring to the proposed formation of the Willamette council, Loder said Monday one of its first projects would be a drive to clear the Willamette river of pollution. Individual clubs in towns along the river have been carrying on this campaign for several years, he said.

Already six councils of clubs have been formed within the Oregon federation over the state, Loder reported. Object is to consolidate local clubs so that the area fishing and hunting problems may be discussed and met on a district basis.
