'The Beggar's Opera' to Be Given Here

Summer players at Willamette university will present a well known English comedy with real flavor of the 18th century, "The Beggar's Opera" at Waller hall, August 15 and 16. Mrs. Margaret Ringnald is the director.

Though John Gay's rollicking comedy is called an opera, it is actually a play, making fun of the stilted opera of the day and satirizing the corruption in public office and the general behavior of society in a way which suits the occasion just as well now.

Waller hall is said particularly suited to the "Beggar's Opera," with its rectangular-room type of stage common to that time. The acting takes place on the stage apron, the actors speaking now and then directly to the audience.

Carl Ritchie designed the backdrop from authentic pictures, and it is being constructed by Bob Scott and painted by Frances Sopp. There is little furniture and no changes of set.

After considerable research, music for the songs was selected for the play, and was borrowed from public library in Seattle by Dan Graves, Willamette's librarian.

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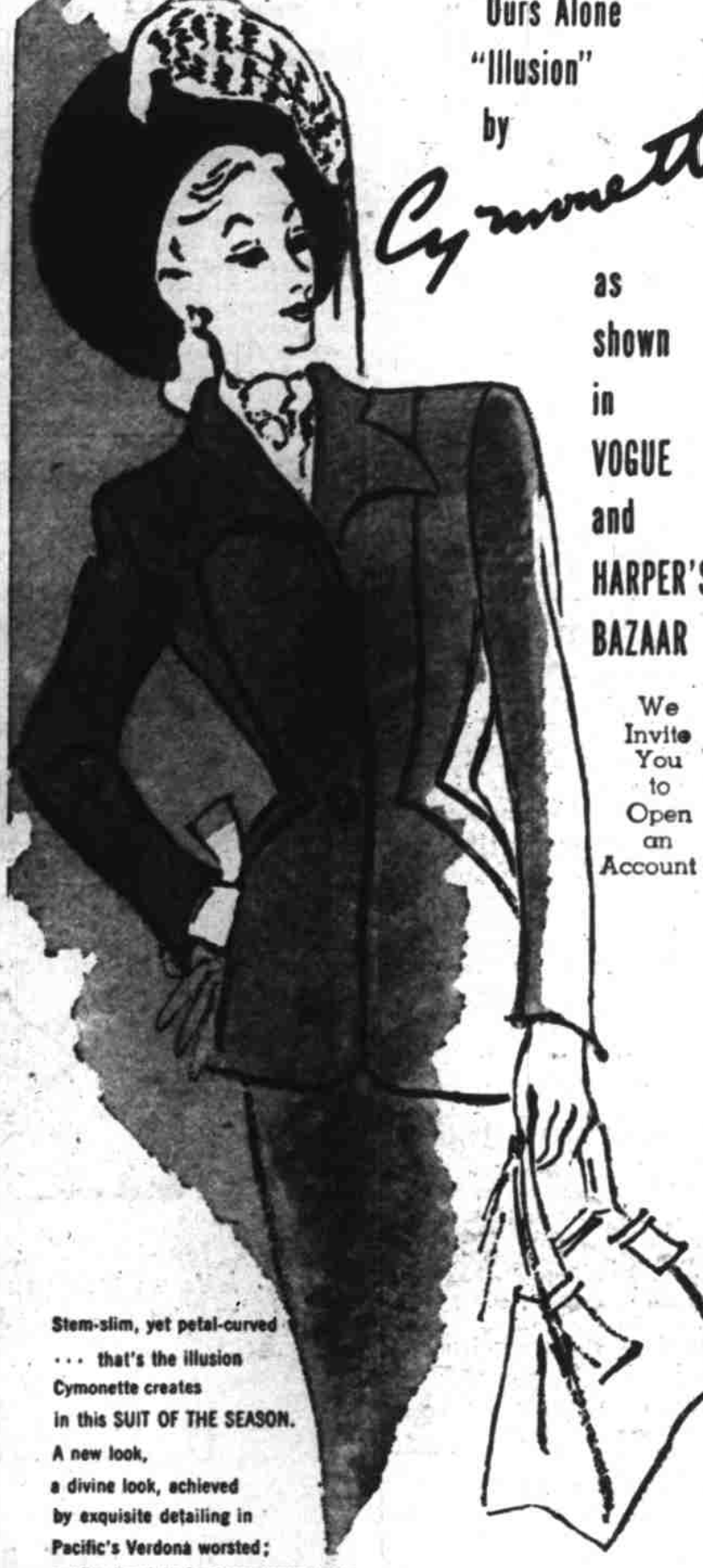
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
