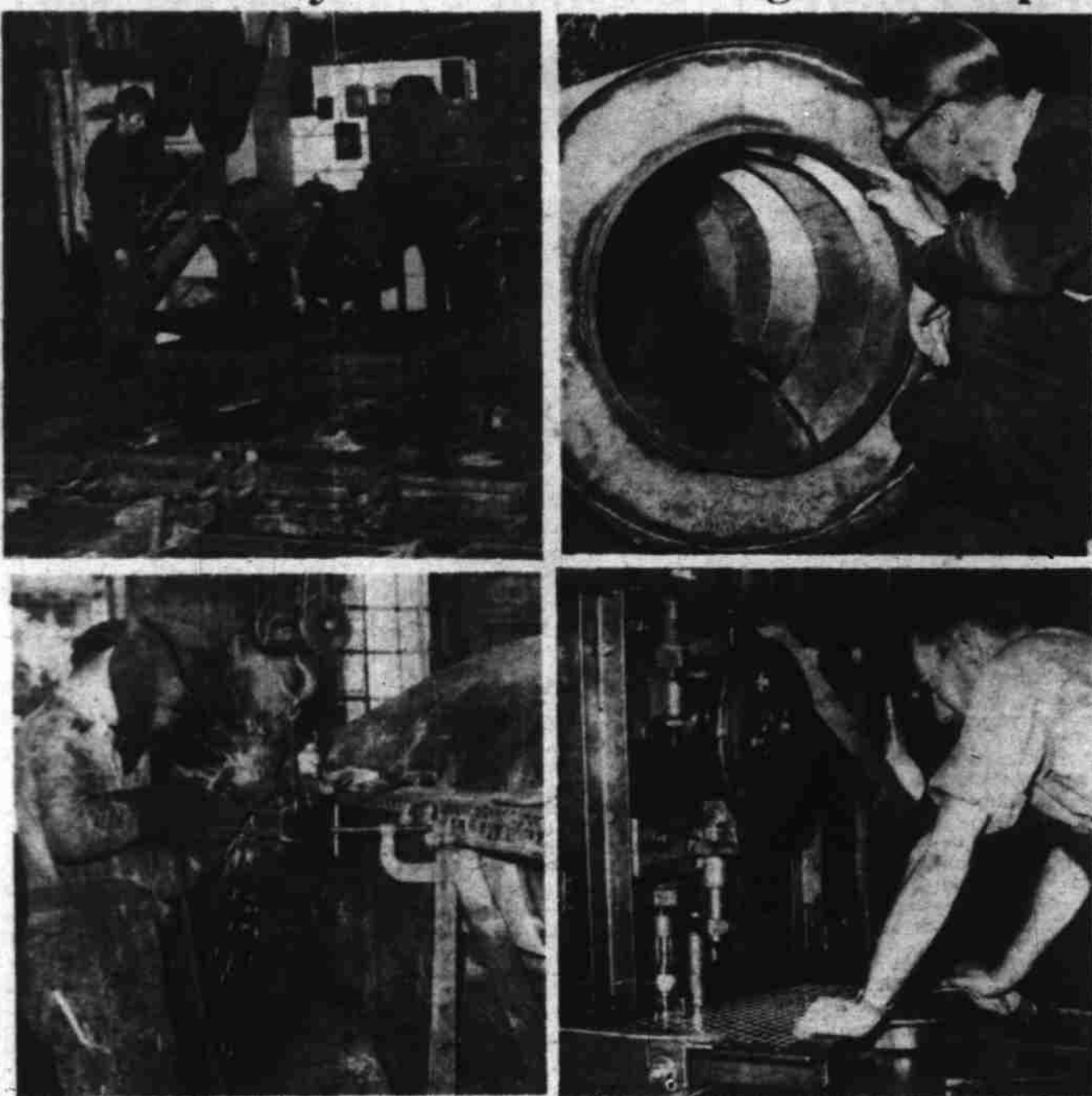


Furnaces Only Part of Rosebraugh Co. Output Furnace Firm Lays Claim to Pioneer Status

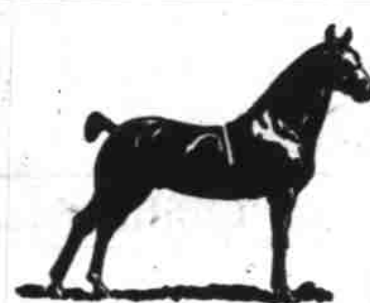

Complete machine shops, welding and foundry works facilitate manufacture of these varied items. While young Rosebraugh wouldn't commit himself he did indicate that new products and new expansion would be added to the already long line of Rosebraugh products and extensive shops as growing Salem and the northwest need them.

'Under Stars' Masonic Rite Plans Finished

Preparations have been completed by Salem Masonic lodge 4 for its second "under the stars" initiation Saturday night, to which it has invited Masons from all Oregon. With several hundred

visitors expected, signs are to be placed at all strategic points in areas leading to the natural amphitheatre on Bald mountain in the Eola hills. Carleson, chairman for arrangements. James L. Cooke, worthy master of the lodge, advised Masons to come prepared for a cool evening in the hills, including blankets or cushions for seating. Hot drinks and sandwiches are to be available at a concession. The site is reached from the Salem-Dallas highway by turning north at Brunks corner east of Rickreall, or from highway 59W by turning east two miles north of Rickreall. Adequate parking is said to be available within a block of the amphitheatre.
