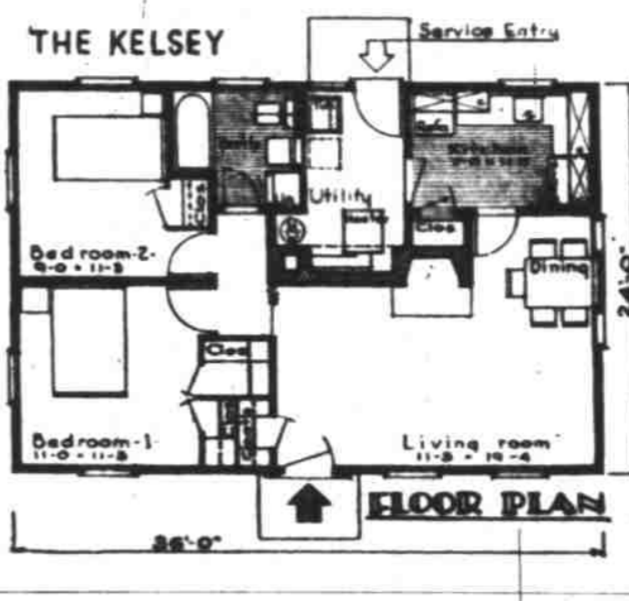
He had received a call for a pastorate in Bellingham, Wash., recently. Eighty-three votes were cast unanimously against the acceptance of the resignation.

THE KELSEY — Cool as a cucumber, crisp as a fresh lettuce, neat as a clipped hedge, are the simple lines this Colonial cottage, 36 ft. by 24 ft., with 864 sq. ft. of floor area. While not absolute minimum in small houses, it is small enough to be built economically. The few extra feet of floor space provide extra refinements. An "L" shaped living room nineteen feet long with dining space under the three-sash picture window; a number of roomy closets; the luxury of a fireplace permissible. To save cost it may be built without basement, the heater domestic hot water tank and laundry tubs going in the utility room. The Kelsey conforms to requirements of F.H.A. Its electrical plan approved by National Adequate Wiring Bureau. Check of Drivers' Licenses Urged

Oregon motorists Friday were urged by Secretary of State Robert S. Farrell, jr., to check their drivers' licenses immediately. He said thousands of expired licenses are in circulation. "Every Oregon driver's license numbered between 5 R-66,000 and 5-R-99,000 must be renewed this month," Farrell said. Any with a serial number lower than 5 R-66,000 has been void for some time. Under a 1947 legislative act every permit in the state will expire sometime during the next two years.

16 Indoneses Found Adrift In Wide Pacific

PEARL HARBOR, Aug. 8 (AP) — Sixteen Indonesians in the final stages of starvation have been rescued by the navy from a small ship adrift in the region of the Palau east of the Philippines. A dispatch to Pacific fleet headquarters today said the Indonesians had left Moroti, about 500 miles southeast of Mindanao, where they had been on a visit for their home island of Talaur.

BOISE, Idaho, Aug. 8 (AP) — Flames roared uncontrolled tonight through more than 2,600 acres of rich timber lands in the Boise national forest. Nearly 600 firefighters labored ceaselessly against two widely separated blazes.

Bikini Ships Still Being De-Atomized

WASHINGTON, Aug. 8 (AP) — The navy announced today that target ships which survived the Bikini atom bomb tests 13 months ago have arrived at west coast and Hawaiian ports and although still "unsafe" there is no danger to inhabitants. The navy said clean-up crews, working only a few hours a day, are slowly and carefully removing the dangerous radioactive contamination following a meeting of the ships' paint with secret acids and washing down the vessels with special fluids.
