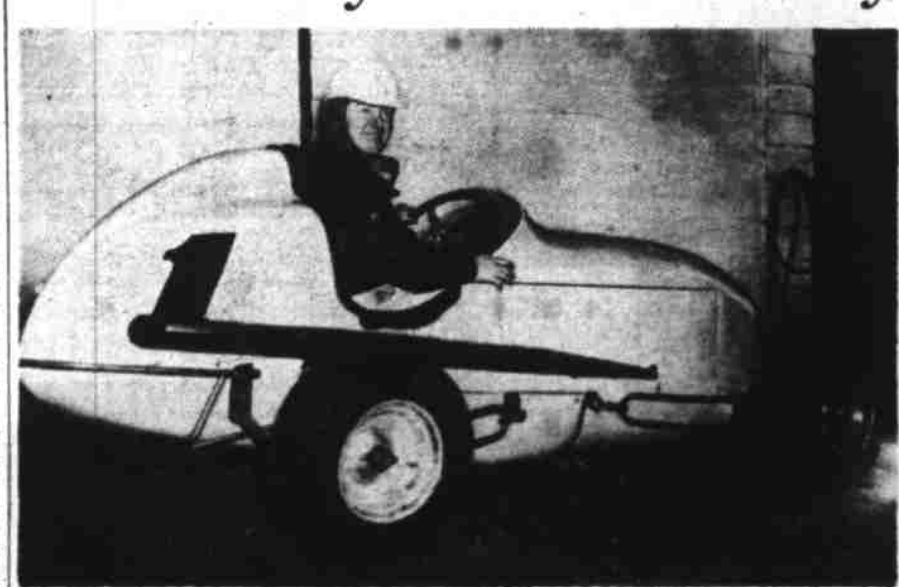

**Golfing 'Fame' Hall Entered by Atlantan**

**EVANSTON, Ill., Aug. 16. (AP)**—Completing the first double-slam in the half century history of western competition, Louise Suggs of Atlanta, Ga., saved her best shots for the final round today to trounce newcomer Carol Diring of Tiffin, O., 9 and 8 and win the women's western amateur golf championship.

The triumph earned Miss Suggs a niche in the W. G. A. hall of fame as the first golfer to win both the western amateur and western open in successive years.

But the heavily talented Athletics boomed across six runs with a rally to win the nightcap finally, 8-6. The series ended 3-1 for Victoria, now only a game behind the third place Senators in the torrid league race.

Kenny Wyatt, despite but two days' rest, hurled the 9-5 win for Salem and was backed up by Bill Beard's perfect 5-for-5 hitting. Beard and Eddie Barr smashed home runs and Wyatt fanned 10. Bus Sporer finished up and suffered the loss via two Vic runs in the eighth.

Barr clouted a four-run homer in the seventh to put Salem ahead 6-2, the blow coming off Bob Jensen, Victoria fastballer. The victory was Wyatt's 15th of the season. The Senators return home to play Portland Monday night and Yakima in a doubleheader Tuesday night.

**PORTLAND, Aug. 16. (AP)**—A pair of heavy lines in front of big, fast backs will work on Multnomah stadium's new turf here Sunday night as the Brooklyn Dodgers and the Los Angeles Dons open the 1947 gridiron play.

The pre-season game for the two All-America conference eleven marks a return appearance for the Dodgers who trained a year ago at Bend, Ore.—but although there are a few familiar faces, the squad has a new coaching staff and a long roster of new hands. The Dons flew into town today while the Dodgers have been drilling here all week.

Fans at the game, starting at 8:30 p.m., will be in on the preview of the Dodgers' "stand-up" line—a resurrection by Coach Cliff Battles from the offensive play of the 1890s.

**Palmer Holds Portland Lead; Yanks, Bums Win, Up Margins**

**Congdon Second; Hogan Far Back**

**Portland, Ore., Aug. 16. (AP)**—Little Johnny Palmer came marching home again today in one of the finest continuous golfing spurges in many a tournament to retain his lead in the Portland open, a \$10,000 links test. He posted a 68 in his third round to rack up a total of 204 for the 54 holes of the 72-hole event.

Many an expert thought the virtual newcomer to tour competition—he got into the swing only in early 1946—would crack or at least falter in the vital third round. Instead, he posted his third successive sub-par effort. The Badin, N. C., pro started the tournament with a 66 to take the front position and maintained it through the halfway station yesterday with a 70.

His 204 was two strokes ahead of his nearest rival, lanky Charles Congdon of Tacoma, Wash., who incidentally put together the best round of the day—a 66—for a 206.

Other positions as the final round approaches Sunday: Al Smith, Winston-Salem, N.C., 207; Jim Ferrer, San Francisco, George Payton, Hampton, Va., and Larry Lamberger, Portland, 208s. Favorite Ben Hogan trailed with a 212.
