New NLRB Puts Pressure on Present Suits; Action Varied

WASHINGTON, Aug. 21.—(AP)—Labor management relations moved into a new era under the Taft-Hartley act tonight as the government issued new rules and its conciliation service headed for a shakeup.

With the new law fully effective at midnight, these things happened:

1. The national labor relations board put more pressures on unions by announcing a strict policy regarding the hundreds of cases now pending before the board in Washington.
2. The U. S. chamber of commerce commended the new act and said that calling it a "slave labor law" is "absurd."
3. The AFL and CIO kept silent. Their policies toward the new act with its many curbs on unions have been fully formed.
4. But the AFL International Typographical union, in convention at Cleveland, approved a policy of signing no more contracts with employers.
5. The communications workers of America announced it has registered under the new law and its officers have provided sworn statements that they are not communist sympathizers. The machinists union registered yesterday.
6. The CIO Longshoremen's union in San Francisco warned shippers of the possibility of a west coast maritime tieup Friday and advised locals of an impending "lockout." The west coast dispute is based on employer refusal to recognize unionization of long-shore walking bosses.
7. A Ford spokesman said the new agreement with UAW was signed at 11:59 p. m., or one minute before the Taft-Hartley law, forbidding union shops without a majority approval of a firm's employees, went into effect.
8. The agreement, subject to union ratification, gives members a choice of a pension plan with a seven cents an hour increase or a 15 cents an hour increase. On Aug. 5 the UAW obtained immunity for a year from the new law's provisions allowing a company to sue a union for strike damage.
9. In New York the executive board of the CIO American Communications association, claiming 35,000 members, voted today to refuse to submit any issues to the Taft-Hartley national labor relations board.
10. The NLRB, which becomes mainly a labor court under the new law, announced it has 605 old cases pending.
11. The board ruled that 410 of these — which are petitions for plant elections to determine what union, if any, shall represent the workers — will be dismissed un-

less the unions involved comply with the registration and non-communist provisions of the law within 20 days.

The board ruled that 195 cases in which unions have charged employers with "unfair labor practices" will be decided under the new law, and not the law as it existed when the alleged practices occurred.

Russia Vetoes New Members; Power Decried

LAKE SUCCESS, Aug. 21.—(AP)—Russia vetoed the aspirations of Italy and Austria for membership in the United Nations today and provoked an angry outcry over the big power voting privilege the soviet union now has used 18 times to block security council majorities.

Argentina moved swiftly to seek abolition of the veto privilege by submitting a resolution for the consideration of the general assembly when it meets in New York Sept. 16.

The Argentine government asked that the assembly call a general conference of all the United Nations three days after the 55-nation body concludes its forthcoming session in order to consider revising the veto section of the U. N. charter.

This move was expected to set off the hottest battle in the assembly yet over the veto. Since the organization was founded the small powers have fought unsuccessfully to abolish this big power privilege.

'Hanging' Man Proves Dummy

EUGENE, Ore., Aug. 21.—(AP)—Lane County Sheriff Tom Swartz went into hiding today from further tourist reports of a suicide by hanging near McKenzie river bridge.

The peace officer has been patiently explaining that what looks like a human suspended from a cable is in reality a dummy rigged by RKO radio studio construction men to warn amateur fliers who insist on "buzzing" the set where scenes are being filmed for the pioneer romance, "Rachel," starring Loretta Young.

Several pilots narrowly have escaped disaster in flying low over the river and striking the cable.

All But Four Markets Sign

Threat of a city-wide butchers strike involving about 70 Salem meat cutters faded completely Thursday night when all but four of the 29 markets involved had agreed to new union contracts.

The remaining four markets are expected to sign today, said H. E. Barker, representing Salem meat cutters' local 297. The new contracts call for \$65 for a 48-hour week, representing an increase of \$10 per week. Deadline for signing the contracts was to have been today.

Thursday 14 independent meat dealers, represented by H. E. Carlson of Portland, secretary of the independent retail meat dealers association, signed contracts with the union. Six other markets had already signed.

Main argument of the meat dealers represented by Carlson centered around unqualified meat cutters receiving the new \$65 weekly journeyman pay scale. The new contract calls for an examination board to be set up by the union and dealers to determine the qualifications of journeyman meat cutters with three "years" experience, Carlson and Barker said.

Salem's five Safeway stores, which have previously rejected the Sunday closing clause of the proposed contract, accepted the agreement in its entirety Thursday on a temporary basis. Barker said that the arrangement was made yesterday by union and Safeway store officials in San Francisco. The temporary settlement, including Sunday closing, will remain in effect until a new agreement is negotiated in the "near future," Barker said.

Chiefs of Air, Army and Navy Offices Named

WASHINGTON, Aug. 21.—(AP)—W. Stuart Symington received a presidential appointment today as the first secretary of a separate department of the air forces under a unified national defense.

Symington has been assistant secretary of war for air under Secretary of War Royall. The latter was named secretary of the department of the army. Royall loses his cabinet office in the shift.

Undersecretary of the Navy John L. Sullivan drew the job of

secretary of the navy department. He succeeds James V. Forrestal, who was appointed in July to be the first secretary of the unified department of national defense.

President Truman announced the assignments at a news conference. They will become effective about mid-September when Forrestal takes command of the defense organization and becomes its only representative in the cabinet.

The senate must pass on them when congress reconvenes in January.

Jewish Refugees Refuse to Leave Ship

PORT DE BOUNC, Friday, Aug. 22.—(AP)—Jewish refugees aboard one of three British ships riding at anchor off this port indicated today they would refuse to land in France and thus would be subject to a British order shipping them to Hamburg, Germany.

The Jews, thwarted by the British in their attempt to enter Palestine without proper credentials last month, were notified yesterday by British consular officials they would be sent to Hamburg if they refused to disembark here by 5 p. m. today (9 a. m. Pacific Standard Time).

The British officials said a Jewish spokesman on the transport "Ocean Vigor" told them the passengers on that ship would not land. Jews aboard the other two transports did not signify their intentions immediately, but it was believed they also would refuse to land on French soil, having previously declared they would leave the ships voluntarily only in Palestine.

Experts Strive To Aid Britain As Loan Slides

WASHINGTON, Aug. 21.—(AP)—Anglo-American negotiators struggled against time today to bolster Britain's historic role in world commerce as the \$3,750,000,000 British loan funds plunged toward a low of \$400,000,000.

Financial experts met in three closed sessions at the treasury, working under the breathing spell provided by last night's "freeze" of British dollar exchange, to consider further steps.

The treasury said Sir Wilfrid Eady, British delegation chief, told of prospects for a boost in coal production in the British isles to a point where coal exports might reach their prewar volume and

thus earn needed foreign exchange.

Both sides agreed that it is possible to be "fairly optimistic" in estimating prospects for increasing British exports.

"Particular reference" was laid during today's meeting on the problem of maintaining food imports at a level adequate to satisfy the British civilians, it said.

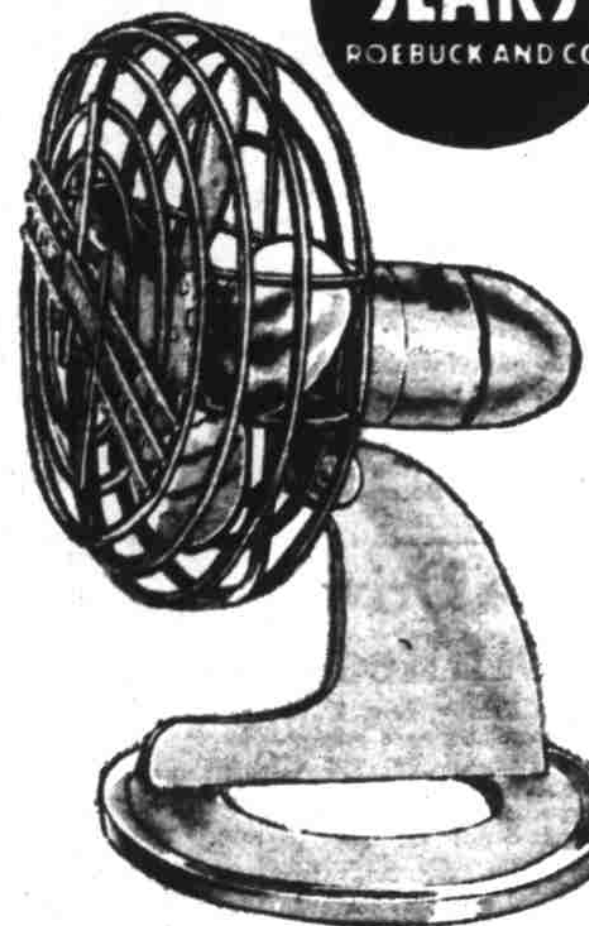
