Fall Wheat Up To Peak \$2.50

CHICAGO, Aug 27—(AP)—Further indications of low food supplies in Europe, plus a hike in the government buying price for export flour, sent wheat to new seasonal highs on the board of trade today. September wheat crossed \$2.50, highest ever reached by a September contract.

Wheat closed 1 3/4 to 4 1/4 higher, September \$2.50 3/4 to 1/2, corn was 1 to 1 1/4 higher, September \$1.09 3/4 to \$1.10.

The production and marketing administration hiked its flour buying price 20 cents a hundred pounds, prices varying for different grades and point of delivery. This made up the reduction announced after the July drop in wheat prices.

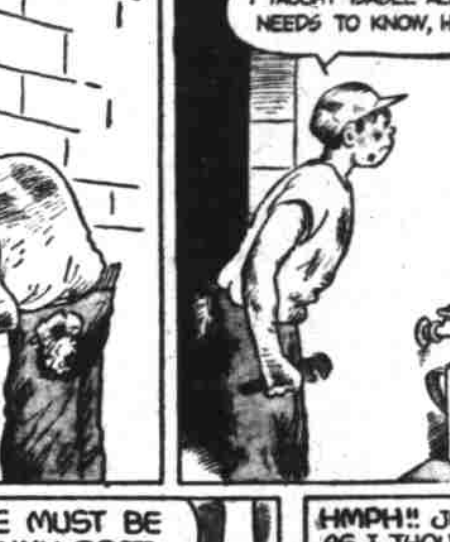
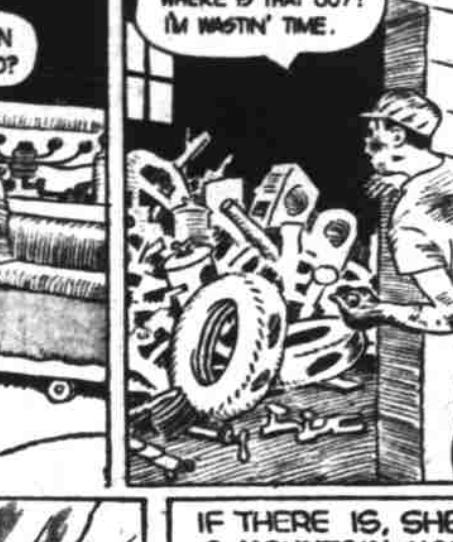
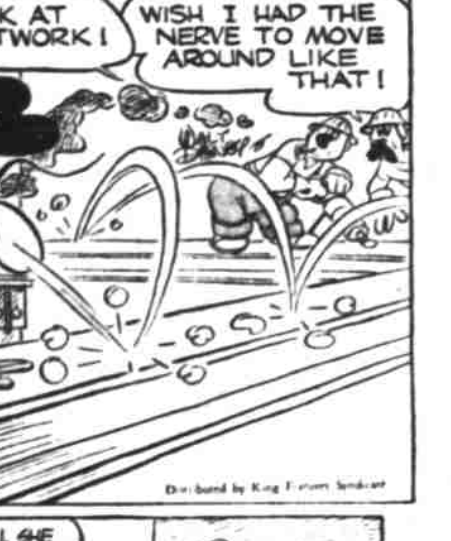

Land Leveling Means To Be Demonstrated

Land leveling equipment and operation methods will be demonstrated at the Lee Foster farm one mile north of Alford Station between Halsey and Harrisburg September 9, reports O. E. Mike-sell, Linn county agent. The meeting is sponsored jointly by the Linn-Lane Soil Conservation district and the Oregon State college extension service.

Gerald T. Newcomb, soil conservationist from the college, has made arrangements for nine equipment manufacturing firms to bring in 13 pieces of land leveling machinery for demonstration. The machinery will operate on a 25 acre tract that Foster will flood irrigate and seed to Ladino clover pasture.

Slow Session On Wall Street

NEW YORK, Aug 27—(AP)—The stock market today slept through the slowest session in nearly three years with assorted leaders establishing modest recoveries while many issues did nothing or extended their declines.

An early forward shift, led by rails, failed to attract much of a following and trends soon turned moderately irregular. Transfers of 480,000 shares compared with 620,000 Tuesday and were a low for 5 hours since September 18, 1944.

Some demand, mainly by professionals, was based on the hope that a September rally would eventuate if soldier bonus spending develops as a business prop and reinvestment demand revives.

Ex-Salem Blacksmith Succumbs in Portland

Shifting Lumber Upsets 2 Trucks

STAYTON—While hauling lumber from Mill City to The Dalles, H. E. and S. G. Whitney of Portland, escaped with minor injuries shortly after noon Monday on highway 222 at the Goode turn just east of town.

The two men, father and son, were driving trucks belonging to the Willamette Hauling company of Portland.

It was reported that the load on the first truck, driven by the father, shifted and turned the truck over on the side. The son, in the second truck braked suddenly to avoid the crash and the lumber on his truck came forward into the cab. The truck ran into the bank on the turn.

A telephone pole was sheared off in the crash and the phone company arrived on the scene to repair it at once. The Stayton Volunteer Fire department was called out to stand by as there was considerable gasoline on the highway and danger of fire. The Harris Wrecking company also responded.
