

Many Pickles Being Grown At Jefferson

JEFFERSON-Growing cucumbers for sale to commercial pickling firms is one of the leading truck farm crops in this commueight tons were shipped out of here last season and prospects are that more will leave here this

From 10 to 14 tons of picklingsize sucumbers are shipped by truck to Portland from here each night, and 107 acres in this vicinity are contracted to Libby, Mc-

Neal & Libby of Portland. Growers realize from 20 tons down per acre and are paid according to grade. Number ones sell for \$160 per ton, No. 2's for \$80, No. 3's for \$30, and miscellaneous grades, \$12.50 per ton. The price paid this year is the same as that of last year, with the exception of the No. 2 grade which is \$10 higher.

The top income per acre on cucumbers reported here last year was \$1389.15. Harry Anderson is here, assisted by William Lake.

HAULING RESTRICTED

Log hauling will be permitted on the Mount Hood loop highway, starting Wednesday, daily except Saturdays, Sundays and holidays between Barlow pass and Cooper spur from 10 p.m. to 8 a.m., the state state highway commission has announced. Between 8 a.m. and 10 p.m. this section of the highway will be closed to log hauling and will be open to all other traffic.

SHANGHAI, Friday, Aug. 29 advised them that Russian ships of Dairen. have been forbidden to trade between Dairen and other ports in

The new order also prohibits Mrs. Frances Turner. other foreign ships from calling between soviet-occupied Dairen and China ports. However, Russia allows only Russian ships to use the South Manchurian port.

The China Daily Tribune said the step was taken by the Chinese government because "the taking over of Dairen (by China) has been obstructed." Control of Dai-

ren was supposed to pass to China under a treaty with Russia.
