

Lewis Abandons 200 NLRB Cases

WASHINGTON, Sept. 24 (AP)—John L. Lewis, who refuses to sign an affidavit swearing he's not a communist, is permitting 200 cases involving his miscellaneous district 30 to go by default at the national labor relations board. Lewis, a long-time foe of communists, made known his opposition to signing the affidavit re-

quired by the Taft-Hartley labor act two weeks ago. Under a ruling by NLRB general Counsel Robert N. Denham, all AFL and CIO officers must sign or none of their affiliated unions may use the board.

Fall said the two men were presumed dead.
