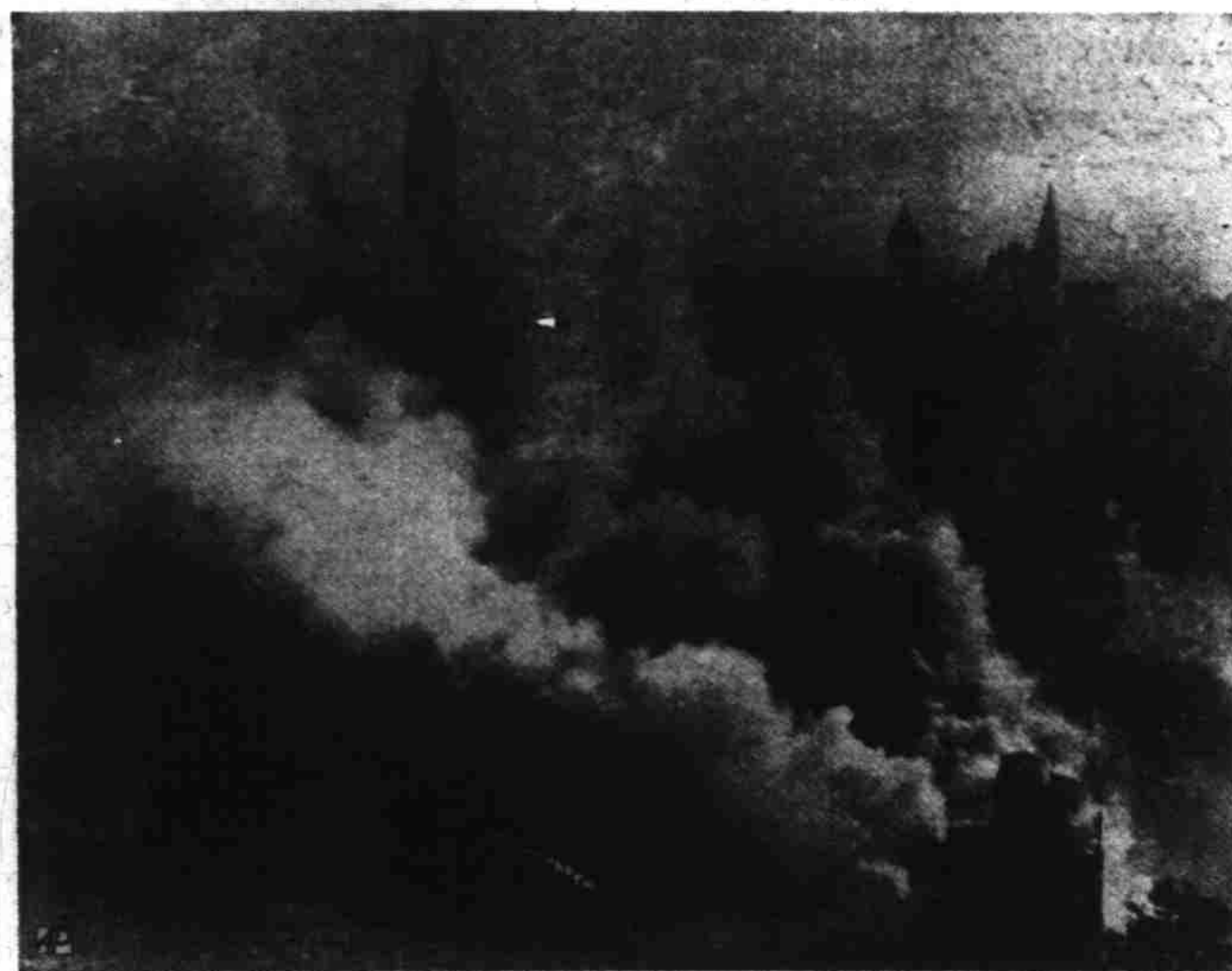
The local Farmers Union will hold its first fall meeting Friday night, October 3. No host supper at 7:30.

## Final Services Set Today for Edward Boas

Funeral services for Edward L. Boas, 84, will be conducted by the Christian Science church in the Howell-Edwards chapel today at 2 p. m. with concluding services at Belcrest Memorial park. Born in Scranton, Pa., October 5, 1863, Boas had been a resident of Salem for 31 years. He was employed by the Oregon state hospital for 25 years. His wife, Emily B. Boas, died here in 1944. He is survived by a nephew, Don Primrose, Baltimore, Md.

Boas died Sunday in a local hospital from injuries incurred when he apparently fell in his home at 641 N. 20th st., sometime last week. He was found on the floor of his bedroom Saturday by city police and District Attorney Miller Hayden after neighbors heard him cry for help and notified police.

Both Mr. and Mrs. Boas had been in vaudeville for several years, and he had sung bass with the Metropolitan male quartet in New York City. They came to Salem upon leaving vaudeville and both were employed here at the state hospital.
