

Crash Victim 'Unchanged'

Raymond P. Gascon, 21, Salem route 3, confined in the veterans hospital at Portland with critical injuries received September 19, when his plane crashed in the Prospect district south of here, remained "unchanged," according to report received by the Associated Press in Portland from hospital authorities. Gascon was taken to Salem General hospital following the accident, and was still unconscious when transferred to the VA hospital September 27.

Church Remodeling at Silverton Progresses

SILVERTON — Work is progressing rapidly on remodeling of Immanuel Lutheran church, the Rev. S. L. Almie, pastor, reported Wednesday. While no definite date has been set for completion, hopes are to have it in use at the holiday season.

Pietro Belluschi of Portland is the architect and the changes include 10 new Sunday school class rooms, a fellowship room, a youth room and a new kitchen. The front of the church has been remodeled so that the vestibule is larger, and the nave has been enlarged to the front of the church to provide for the choir, and the former choir space has been added to the auditorium. The stenciling on the ceiling of the nave is patterned after old Lutheran churches in Europe. Cost is estimated at \$25,000.

A dedication service of the remodeled church will be held at its completion.

COBBLER QUICKIE:

Cover bottom of well-greased square cake pan with fruit about 2 inches deep—cherries, sliced apples or what-have-you. Mix topping of 1 cup each flour and brown sugar with some cinnamon; cut in 1/4 cup shortening; sprinkle over fruit; pat down. Bake at 350° F. about half an hour. Easy to eat.

JIFFY APPLE PIE: Slice apples into greased casserole; sprinkle liberally with cinnamon and sugar; dot with butter and top with rich pastry. So good! Make it even better! Spread meringue over crust of baked pie (beat granulated sugar into stiffly beaten egg whites, 2 tablespoons per white); sprinkle with slivered toasted almonds. Brown in moderate oven—about 15 minutes.
