

# Polling Places Designated for Salem Annexation Vote Oct. 7

Salem and annexation area voters will go to the polls between 8 a. m. and 8 p. m. Tuesday to determine whether this city shall add to its territory six areas to the north and south of city limits. The areas aggregate 1,025 acres and at present house some 500 residents. Salem voters at their precinct polling places are to vote separately on all six areas (shown by picture and map on page 14) but accomplishment of the annexation also requires favorable majority vote in the outside areas.

Annexation will be decided by fewer than 14,000 citizens, as registration totals only 13,311 in the city and 330 in annexation areas. Registration in the outside areas, based on pollbooks prepared by the city, is: A, 58; B, 53; C, nine; D, 64, and E, 146.

Areas "C" and "E" are primarily industrial sites, but the latter tops the population list—because it is by far the largest
