Residents in each area except "F" will mark their "yes or no" choice, but in "F" a decision in favor of annexation already is provided by annexation petitions whose signers represented 100 per cent of the

Annexation will be decided by fewer than 14,000 citizens, as registration totals only 13,311 in the city and 330 in annexation areas. Registration in the outside areas, based on pollbooks prepared by the city, is: A, 58; B, 53; C, nine; D, 64, and E, 146.

Areas "C" and "E" are primarily industrial sites, but the latter tops the population list-or at least the registered voter listbecause it is by far the largest


